> NATIONAL MARINE FISHERIES SERVICE ENFORCEMENT REPORT FOR THE PERIOD JUNE 1 THROUGH AUGUST 31, 1993

During the reporting period NMFS and the Coast Guard opened a total of 151 investigations. NMFS initiated 58 investigations. 3 of these cases originated from the observer program.

Further actions were also taken on 179 pending case during the reporting period. 28 investigations were closed as unfounded. An additional 3 investigations were closed due to lack of enforcement resources. 17 cases were handled with written warnings and 9 cases were handled with summary settlement offers totaling \$8,050 in assessed penalties. 24 cases were settled through voluntary abandonment with property valued at \$29,375. 41 cases were referred to NOAA General Counsel. General Counsel issued 29 Notices of Violation assessing a total of \$208,836 in penalties. An additional 22 Notices of Violation were settled by General Counsel with penalties totalling \$170,351. One District Court civil forfeiture case was settled for \$175,000. Five cases were referred to the U.S. Attorney's Office for criminal prosecution.

Observer initiated cases resulted in 1 written warning and 2 assignments for further investigation.

Enforcement actions initiated during the June 1 - August 31 period:

- 1) June 6, 1993 The halibut skiff AK6955K was cited in Sitka, AK, for fishing without an IPHC license. The defendant paid a \$266 summary settlement penalty. The vessel hails from Petersburg, AK.
- 2) June 13, 1993 The F/V KILL SHOT was cited in Homer, AK, for possession of 16 undersize halibut. The defendant paid a \$2,400 summary settlement penalty and forfeited the undersize halibut. The halibut were donated to a local charity. The vessel hails from Keni, AK.
- 3) June 13, 1993 The F/V DUTCH OMEGA was cited in Homer, AK, for possession of halibut of indeterminate length. The defendant paid a \$1,050 summary settlement penalty and forfeited 30 halibut fillets. The halibut were donated to a local charity. The vessel hails from Seward, AK.
- 4) June 15, 1993 The F/V JADE ALASKA was cited in Kodiak, AK, for exceeding directed fishing standards for sablefish by 143%. \$1,030 in proceeds from the sale of the sablefish were seized. Disposition of the case is pending. The vessel is home ported in Kodiak.
- 5) June 17, 1993 The F/V DOMINION was cited in Kodiak, AK, for exceeding directed fishing standards for sablefish by 74%. \$1,124 in proceeds from the sale of the sablefish overage were seized. Disposition of the case is pending. The vessel is home ported in Kodiak, AK.

- 6) June 26, 1993 The F/V SABRA ANN was cited at Sitka, AK, for fishing without an IPHC license. The defendant paid a \$734 summary settlement penalty. The vessel is home ported in Juneau, AK.
- 7) July 30, 1993 The F/V MARTUSHOFF was cited at Seward, AK, for fishing without a Federal Groundfish Permit. The defendant paid a \$750 summary settlement penalty. The vessel hails from Seward, AK.
- 8) August 7, 1993 The F/V WOOD CUTTER was cited at Petersburg, AK, for fishing without an IPHC license. The defendant was offered a \$520 summary settlement. Disposition of the case is pending. The vessel hails from Petersburg.
- 9) August 13, 1993 The F/V AMBER DAWN was cited at Kodiak, AK, for exceeding directed fishing standards for sablefish by 26%. \$1,911 in proceeds from the sale of the sablefish overage were seized. Disposition of the case is pending. The vessel hails from Kodiak, AK.
- 10) August 13, 1993 The F/V TOPAZ was cited at Kodiak, AK, for exceeding directed fishing standards for sablefish by 50%. \$950 in proceeds from the sale of the sablefish overage were seized. Disposition of the case is pending. The vessel hails from Kodiak, AK.

Enforcement actions initiated prior to the June 1/August 31 period which were not previously reported:

1) July 17, 1993 - NMFS referred an Offense Investigation Report to NOAA General Counsel alleging violations of the observer plan by the F/V SOUTHERN WIND. General Counsel subsequently issued a Notice of Violation and Assessment (NOVA) to the owners and operator of the SOUTHERN WIND charging them with 3 counts including: (1) impeding, intimidating and interfering with an observer by verbal harassment, (2) tampering, destroying and discarding the observers notebook and records, and (3) sexual harassment. The observer was deployed aboard the vessel from July 5, 1992, through August 19th, 1992. The NOVA assesses a \$20,000 civil penalty. Disposition of the case is pending.

#### NOAA OFFICE OF GENERAL COUNSEL ALASKA REGION SIGNIFICANT PROSECUTIONS JULY - SEPTEMBER 1993

Vessel Incentive Program; Enforcement Hearings

Hearings for three Vessel Incentive Program cases were held on August 4-6 in Seattle, Washington. Respondents in two of the cases are Fishing Company of Alaska and the operators of the F/V Alaska Ranger and F/V Alaska I for alleged violations occurring during the months of June and July in 1991. The hearings for the FCA cases are continued until December 15, 1993. The proposed penalty for the two cases combined is \$300,000.

The Respondents in the third case are Pacific Producer, Inc. and Jarl Hogseth of the F/V Pacific Enterprise. The violation is alleged to have occurred during May, 1991. Final arguments are scheduled to be submitted on September 22, and replies must be submitted by October 12, 1993. The proposed penalty for the VIP violation is \$50,000.

## Round Island Case Settled

Since the last Council meeting, a settlement has been reached with the claimant in a Round Island vessel forfeiture case. In July, U.S. v. F/V CONCEPCION, USDC Alaska, was settled for a partial forfeiture of \$175,000. This case arose as part of the joint NOAA/USCG/DOJ investigation and prosecution of 10 factory trawlers for illegal fishing activities during 1991 and 1992 within the closed area surrounding the walrus haul-outs on Round Island.

## Two Observer Sexual Harassment Cases Prosecuted

Since June, three NOVA's have been issued in cases forwarded to GCAK for prosecution of sexual harassment of observers. In the first, F/V DESTINATION, NMFS File No. AK911314, the NOVA assessed a proposed fine of \$10,000; the case has since been settled for \$8,000. In F/V SOUTHERN WIND, NMFS File No. AK920356, two NOVA's were issued with proposed penalties totalling \$35,000.

## U.S. COAST GUARD/NMFS JUNEAU FISHERIES ENFORCEMENT FOR PERIOD June 1, 1993 through August 31, 1993

#### ENFORCEMENT SUMMARY

## a. 1993 High Seas Driftnet Enforcement Summary

On January 1st 1993 the United Nations General Assembly (UNGA) Resolution 46/215 became effective, enacting a global moratorium on large scale high seas driftnet (HSDN) fishing. Coast Guard HSDN patrol efforts this year have been directed towards protecting U.S. origin salmon and monitoring compliance with the UN resolution in the high threat areas of the North Pacific.

In this first year of the moratorium, international cooperation has been the most important ingredient in discouraging attempts to engage in driftnet fishing. The enforcement efforts of the Coast Guard have been part of this cooperative international effort by member nations of the North Pacific Anadromous Fisheries Commission. Exchanges of patrol and sighting information routinely took place between the United States, Canada, Japan and Russia. This international cooperation was successful in locating and removing from the high seas, three vessels claiming People's Republic of China registry, that were equipped to conduct large scale pelagic driftnet fishing (noted in June report). During these cases the People's Republic of China also cooperated by responding quickly to our requests for registry checks and boarding authority. Additionally, they accepted custody of a HSDN vessel and crew claiming their flag. That vessel was escorted by the USCGC SHERMAN (WHEC-720) to an area 40 miles east of Shanghai, where it was turned over to a PRC patrol vessel. Since that time there have been no further incidents. Coast Guard and Canadian flights have also observed evidence of conversions of former HSDN vessels to alternate gear types such as jig fishing.

In support of this cooperative effort, aircraft and cutters based in the Seventeenth Coast Guard District will have flown over 630 hours and patrolled over 180 cutter days by the end of September. We will continue to monitor the traditional high seas driftnet area in the year ahead, adjusting our patrol efforts

consistent with the threat.

## b. Donut Hole

Since a two year moratorium on fishing within the "donut hole" went into effect in January, fishing activity has been significantly reduced. Even though the terms of the moratorium permit each fishing nation a maximum of two "scout" vessels in the area, fewer than that have been observed. Poor fishing is the apparent reason. In July the USCGC YOCONA (WMEC-168) boarded, with the consent on the vessels' masters, "scout" vessels from Japan, Poland, and the Republic of Korea fishing in the "donut hole." The vessels, "DAIAN MARU NO.158" (JA), "ADMIRAL ARCISZEWSKI" (PL), and the "HAN JIN HO" (KS) were found to be legitimately involved in "scout" fishing, in accordance with the moratorium. The boardings not only verified their activities but also obtained information on catch data from each vessel, which was forwarded to the Department of State (OES/OFA) via Coast Guard Headquarters. During the boardings the vessel masters had mentioned there was a noticeable decline in the fishery compared to previous years; the vessels were averaging approximately 20MT/day with extended trawl periods of 17 hours to achieve that number. Coast Guard presence in the "donut hole" this year has demonstrated the United States' commitment to responsible management of foreign fishing in the "donut hole."

## c. Dixon Entrance

Dixon Entrance was aggressively patrolled by U.S. and Canadian vessels and aircraft. Coast Guard Group Ketchikan worked closely with the Canadian DFO this summer to ensure there was a coordinated law enforcement presence throughout Dixon Entrance.

As expected, Canadian fishing vessel presence peaked at the end of July with close to 90 Canadian fishing vessels sighted throughout the area. Due to the joint coordinated patrol effort between the U.S. and Canada, Canadian fishing vessels remained well south of the A/B line and away from undisputed U.S. waters. This was the first year in recent memory where there were no MFCMA violations by Canadian vessels.

Coast Guard patrol boats also provided an overt patrolling presence amongst U.S. fishing vessels working in the disputed zone to reassert the U.S. fisherman's right to fish in that area.

### d. Halibut

For the June Gulf of Alaska opener Coast Guard patrolling presence included 13 cutters, Group Ketchikan Stations, and aircraft from Kodiak, Sitka and a deployed Falcon jet from Astoria. The Coast Guard conducted 318 boardings and cited 34 IPHC violations. Common violations were fishing without an IPHC permit, undersized halibut and possession/use of automated hook permit, undersized halibut and possession/use of automated hook strippers. Six fishing vessels had their voyages terminated for major safety violations.

Results of the September opening will be provided in the December report. Patrolling presence was consistent with the June opener. Preliminary data indicates over 200 boardings conducted. Of particular note was the improved safety. Cutters report that the basic mandates of the Fishing Vessel Safety Act are reaching the fleet. For the most part only relatively minor violations occurred; there was only one 01 voyage terminated.

The Coast Guard also provided aircraft and cutter presence during the Bering Sea halibut openings using resources primarily assigned for monitoring other groundfish fisheries.
