REPORT TO THE NORTH PACIFIC FISHERIES MANAGEMENT COUNCIL CONCERNING COAST GUARD FCMA ENFORCEMENT

- 1. Recent FCMA Infractions. Two reports of violation (civil penalty procedure) and three citations (written warnings) nave been issued since the last council meeting. In addition, one foreign fishing vessels was seized for FCMA infractions. A brief summary of each infraction follows.
- a. 8 September. USCGC CAMPBELL issued a report of violation to the Japanese stern trawler EIKYU MARU No. 11 for failure to maintain an accurate cumulative catch log.
- b. 15 September. Coast Guard Air Station Kodiak issued a citation to the Mexican stern trawler KORMEX 2 for having illegible international radio call signs on both sides of the snip.
- c. 15 September. Coast Guard Air Station Kodiak issued a citation to the Mexican stern trawler KORMEX 5 for having a fender obscuring its international radio call sign on the port side.
- d. 28 September. USCGC CONFIDENCE seized the Japanese longliner FUKUYOSHI MARU No. 8 for underlogging and under reporting its catch by 25 percent.
- e. 28 September. Coast Guard Air Station Kodiak issued a citation to the Polish stern trawler KOLIAS for failure to properly display its international radio call sign.
- f. 28 September. USCGC JARVIS issued a report of violation (4 counts) to the Japanese factory ship NISSHIN MARU No. 2 for failure to accurately log the disposition of four species.
- g. Ø1 October. USCGC JARVIS issued a citation to the Japanese factory ship MINESHIMA MARU for failure to maintain an accurate catch log.

## SUMMARY OF THE SEIZURE OF THE JAPANESE LONG LINER FUKUYOSHI MARU NO. 8

The FUKUYOSHI MARU No. 8 was boarded on 27 September by crewmen from the USCGC CONFIDENCE. The CONFIDENCE had located this vessel setting its gear approximately 200 NM SW of Kodiak Island. The Boarding Party located approximately 48.8 MT more product in the vessel's holds than the cumulative catch log totals indicated should be aboard. Converting the processed weight to round weight it is believed that the vessel has underlogged approximately 68.7 MT of fish or 25 percent of its total catch for this trip. The vessel was seized and escorted to Kodiak where it arrived on 30 September.

The case has been turned over to the U.S. Attorney in Anchorage for prosecution.
