1. U. S. COAST GUARD ENFORCEMENT EFFORT FOR 1985. U. S. Coast Guard enforcement efforts for calendar year 1985, through 1 December, have totalled 773 cutter days and 1,996 aircraft patrol hours. These patrol efforts covered more than 7.5 million square miles of ocean. Combined 1985 enforcement efforts have resulted in the seizure of two foreign fishing vessels (one Taiwanese and one Canadian) and the issuance of 35 reports of violation and 97 written warnings. Additional patrol effort analysis is provided in the enclosures.

2. MFCMA INFRACTIONS. Since the last report to the council (23 September), Coast Guard enforcement efforts have resulted in one vessel seizure, and three reports of violation (civil penalty procedures), and five written warnings being issued to foreign fishing vessels. The following summarizes the major infractions and enforcement activity since September:

a. In September, CCGDSEVENTEEN JUNEAU (oil) issued written warnings to the Japanese stern trawler NISSHIN MARU NO. 51 and the Japanese transport vessel HARUSHIO MARU for failure to submit the required activity message twenty-four hours prior to beginning/ceasing fishing operations within the Fishery Conservation Zone (FCZ).

b. 19 September. USCGC MUNRO issued a report of violation to the Japanese stern trawler MANRYO MARU NO. 52 for fishing in waters deeper than 200 fathoms in the Bering Sea subsequent to the closure of those waters. At the time of the boarding the vessel had made only two hauls, one of which was clearly in waters deeper than 200 fathoms. This haul resulted in no incidental catch of Sablefish.

c. In October, CCGDSEVENTEEN JUNEAU (oil) issued written warnings to the Japanese long liner MITO MARU NO. 82 and the Japanese transport vessel UNO MARU NO. 8 for failure to submit the required activity message twenty-four hours prior to beginning/ceasing fishing operations within the (FCZ).

d. 4 October. USCGC SHERMAN seized the Taiwanese joint venture processor GOLDEN DRAGON NO. 1 near Kodiak. SHERMAN's boarding personnel found approximately 55 lbs of processed Halibut and 150 lbs of processed and round Sablefish secreted in the vessel's freezer holds. GOLDEN DRAGON NO. 1 was taken to Kodiak and held there until a partial bond was posted. The vessel was released from custody on 31 October with the following conditions: That \$10,000 be paid by the vessel's owners prior to the vessel's release from Kodiak, and that the remaining \$75,000 be paid in three installments no later than 31 July 1986. A final condition is that GOLDEN DRAGON NO. 1 is not to leave the FCZ until full payment has been made unless an irrevocable letter of credit is provided.

e. 11 October. USCGC MORGENTHAU issued a written warning to the Japanese long liner FUKUYOSHI MARU NO. 28 for failure to accurately maintain their communications log.

f. 13 October. USCGC MORGENTHAU issued a report of violation to the Japanese stern trawler KAIYO MARU NO. 53 for failure to return prohibited species to the sea as soon as possible after retrieval of net.

g. In November, CCGDSEVENTEEN JUNEAU (oil) issued a written warning to the Japanese stern trawler RYOAN MARU NO. 21 for failure to submit the required activity message twenty-four hours prior to beginning/ceasing fishing operations within the FCZ.
