SUBJECT: Proposed Change in Routine Foreign Permit Review Procedures

### ACTION REQUIRED

Consider modifying the review procedures for the routine approval of foreign fishing vessel permit applications.

#### **BACKGROUND**

Since October, 1977 we have operated with guidelines established by the Foreign Permit Review Subcommittee for the review of foreign fishing vessel permit applications. Those guidelines established five conditions which, when applicable to a foreign vessel application requires review by the North Pacific Fishery Management Council.

- 1. Vessels to be used in support of vessels of a different flag.
- 2. Vessels with a record of violations and record of gear conflicts.
- 3. Vessels of a country which do not have a traditional fishery in the area.
- 4. Vessels planning to employ unusual or unaccustomed types of gear or fishing methods or to target on unaccustomed species.
- 5. Such other applications deemed non-routine by the Executive Director.

Authority has been delegated to the Executive Director for the routine approval of all other foreign permit applications.

The experience to date has shown this to be a workable procedure. However, recently more and more vessels have a record of "insignificant" violations. These, according to the guidelines, cannot be approved by me and must be referred to the Council and the Foreign Permit Review Subcommittee. I propose that vessels with a record of "non-significant, non-catch related" violations be deleted from the list requiring review by the Council's Permit Review Committee.

Attached is a copy of the October 3, 1977 guidelines currently being used. Attached also is a sample of a permit application which, upon examination by the National Marine Fisheries Service, had a violation issued in 1979 and theoretically required Council approval.

A panel of the Foreign Permit Review Subcommittee met here in Juneau and has developed the following purpose language and guidelines for review of foreign permit applications:

### Purpose:

To allow for expeditious Council review of routine foreign fishing vessel permit applications. Review of non-routine permits would be accomplished by the Foreign Permit Application Review Subcommittee and submitted with recommendations to the Council. Public input in accordance with Section 204(b)(5) of the FCMA will be accomplished by publishing permit applications in the Federal Register in accordance with Section 204(b)(4) of the Fishery Conservation and Management Act of 1976.

Foreign vessel applications requiring review by the NPFMC Permit Review Committee are:

- Vessels to be used in support of vessels of a different flag.
- X 2. Vessels with a record of violations and record of gear conflicts.
  - Vessels of a country which does not have a traditional fishery in the area.
  - 4. Vessels planning to employ unusual or unaccustomed types of gear or fishing methods or to target on unaccustomed species.
  - Such other applications deemed non-routine by the Executive Director.

It is my understanding that at least one of the other councils uses a system of executive director review of all foreign permit applications.
