REPORT TO THE NORTH PACIFIC FISHERIES MANAGEMENT COUNCIL
CONCERNING U.S. COAST GUARD FCMA ENFORCEMENT

1. Recent FCMA Infractions. Since the last council meeting nine reports of violation (civil penalty procedure) and seven citations (written warning) have been issued. A brief summary of each infraction follows.

a. 26 September. USCGC MORGENTHAU issued a report of violation to the Japanese longliner ANYO MARU NO. 22 for failure to properly maintain its daily cumulative catch log by underlogging 23 metric tons (17%) of sablefish.

b. 1 October. USCGC MELLON issued a citation to the South Korean longliner SEO KWANG HO for failure to provide a safe boarding ladder for the authorized boarding party.

c. 2 October. Air Station Kodiak issued two reports of violation to the Japanese tanker TENKAI MARU for failure to properly maintain the readability and repair of the vessel's IRCS on both port and starboard sides.

d. 30 October. USCGC MUNRO issued two citations to the South Korean stern trawler SOO GONG NO. 91 for failure to provide a safe boarding ladder for the authorized boarding party; and failure to properly maintain its prohibited species log.

e. 5 November. USCGC JARVIS issued one report of violation and one citation to the South Korean stern trawler NO. 303 DAI HO for failure to provide a safe boarding ladder for the authorized boarding party; and failure to properly maintain its daily cumulative catch log by combining its catch for four different areas into two separate categories. One citation was also issued for failure to properly record the species type (Pacific halibut, Pacific salmon, tanner and opilio crab) in its disposition log of prohibited species.

f. 18 November. USCGC JARVIS issued a citation to the Japanese stern trawler RYUYO MARU for failure to properly maintain the readability of the vessel's starboard side IRCS by placing an obstruction over the middle letters.

g. 19 November. USCGC JARVIS issued two reports of violation to the Taiwanese stern trawler HIGHLY 302 for failure to provide a safe ladder for the authorized boarding party; and failure to log discarded prohibited species (halibut) catches by individual fish rather than in metric tons. One citation was also issued for failure to discard a prohibited species (sponge).

h. 21 November. USCGC JARVIS issued three reports of violation to the South Korean stern trawler DAE JIN NO. 52 for failure to minimize its catch of a prohibited species (halibut), failure to return its catch of prohibited species (halibut) to the sea in a timely manner, and failure to return its catch of a prohibited species (halibut) to the sea with a minimum of damage. The violations issued were based on the boarding party's observations of inattention and negligence by the vessel's master during the catching and processing stages. *N + E - Unusual Process in BS*
