### I. High Seas Drift Net (HSDN) Enforcement

There were no HSDN enforcement activities conducted during the reporting period.

#### II. U.S./Russian Maritime Boundary Line (MBL) Enforcement

Activity along the MBL was low over the reporting period with an average of less than one vessel detected within 20 miles of the MBL during December thorugh March. There have been no detected incursions by FFVs into the U.S. EEZ this season.

#### III. U.S./Canadian EEZ Boundary (Dixon Entrance) Enforcement

There was light fishing activity during the reporting period along the U.S.-Canadian EEZ boundary in the vicinity of Dixon Entrance. All Canadian fishing vessels sighted were south of the A-B line and no incursions into U.S. waters were detected.

On 05 Mar, two representatives from D17(dre) traveled to Victoria, B.C. to meet with the Canadian Department of Fisheries and Oceans (DFO) to plan MDA support for Operation North Pacific Guard 2019 and to establish cooperative lines of effort for participation in the North Pacific Coast Guard Forum, North Pacific Anadromous Fish Commission, and the North Pacific Fisheries Commission.

#### IV. Marine Protected Resources and Critical Habitat Enforcement

The Coast Guard monitors more than 151 critical habitat areas around Alaska each month as part of routine cutter and aircraft patrol activity. A MH-60 collected tissue samples of a dead whale carcass on the beach near Yakutat.

#### V. Commercial Fishing Vessel Boarding Statistics





Figure 2. Fisheries Violations by Year

There were 73 domestic fisheries and fishing vessel safety boardings conducted by the U.S. Coast Guard during the reporting period. These boardings resulted in a total of 7 safety violations onboard 3 vessels. Figures 1 and 2 show the historic trends for boardings and violations. Appendices B and C list the boardings which occurred during the reporting period.

#### VI. Halibut and Sablefish Enforcement

Coast Guard patrols completed 20 boardings on fishing vessels targeting halibut and sablefish during the reporting period. There were 14 boardings of IFQ halibut vessels, detecting no safety violation and no fisheries violations. There were 5 boardings of IFQ sablefish vessels, with no violations detected. No voyages were terminated for significant safety concerns.

There were no boardings on charter vessels targeting halibut. There was one boarding on recreational vessels targeting halibut, detecting no fisheries violations. No voyages were terminated for significant safety concerns.

#### VII. Crab Fisheries


Air Station Kodiak deployed an MH-60 to Cold Bay for the Bering Sea crab season. The MH-60 returned on 15 January 2019 as activity increased in the Bering Sea and Aleutian Island crab and trawl fisheries. As the fleet moved north the MH-60 was transferred to St Paul on 10 February 2019 where it remained until 16 March 2019.

#### VIII. Commercial Fishing Vessel Safety/Search and Rescue Cases

During the reporting period, 7 safety violations were detected on 3 vessels. There were 2 voyage terminations. A comprehensive list of violations can be found in Appendix C.

There were 16 search and rescue (SAR) cases involving fishing vessels in U.S. waters, resulting in six lives saved, zero lives lost, and one vessel sinking. Appendix A provides a comprehensive list of SAR cases involving fishing vessels over the reporting period.


Figure 3. Historical Overview of CFVS Statistics

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Figure 6. Annual H60/65 Hours




Figure 5. Annual Major Cutter Days




Figure 7. Annual Patrol Boat Hours




Figure 8. Dec-Mar HC-130 Hours




Figure 9. Dec-Mar Major Cutter Days






Figure 10. Dec-Mar H60/65 Hours

2/13/19	PACIFIC BELLE	Sector Juneau received a report of vessel without steering. BAILEY BARCO was diverted. Vessel was placed in tow and moored in Petersburg.		
2/15/19	PACIFIC 1	FV KONA KAI relayed a distress message from FV PACIFIC 1. Vessel was taking on water. The crew donned immersion suits and abandon ship. Air Station Kodiak launched a H60 and H65. H65 from Dutch Harbor arrived on scene at the life raft and experienced an over torque on the aircraft. They deployed a data marker buoy before departure. FV KONA KAI arrived on scene and recovered all 5 POB. The FV PACIFIC 1 completely sank.		
2/18/19	KARI MARIE	District 17 received a MEDEVAC request from vessel with an injured crewmember. Air Station Kodiak diverted a C130 for communication coverage and a H60 launched from FOL St Paul. Crewmember was hoisted and transferred to EMS in St Paul.		
2/20/19	TAURUS	District 17 received a report of vessel disabled and drifting toward land. Air Station Kodiak launched a C130 and H60 to respond. Vessel was able to regain power and stayed on a one hour communications schedule with District 17 and another FV escorted the TAURUS back to port.		
2/23/19	KAIA	CGC JOHN MIDGETT received a relayed notification that vessel was aground. CGC JOHN MIDGETT and an H60 were diverted. FVs in the area were able to tow FV KAIA back to port.		
2/24/19	AURORA	District 17 received a relayed message from vessel with an injured crewmember. District 17 monitored vessel and injured crewmember until arrival in port.		
2/25/19	VAERDAL	D17 received a MEDEVAC request for a sick crewmember. The H65 from CGC JOHN MIDGETT launched and transferred the crewmember to EMS in Cold Bay.
