# Comparison of Prohibited Species (Bycatch) Management Programs in North Pacific Groundfish Fisheries

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### Background

US managers have implemented a series of management actions to reduce and/or manage bycatch of prohibited species (salmon, Pacific halibut, Pacific herring and crab) in the North Pacific groundfish fisheries. Prohibited species must be avoided in target groundfish fisheries, and must be carefully released in some cases. Attainment of bycatch (or Prohibited Species Catch (PSC)) limits, or their seasonal or fishery sector apportionments, results in closure of the fishery in which that bycatch is taken. Such closures result in economic losses to groundfish fishermen and processors, and the communities that support these operations. In the absence of limits, bycatch has been managed using time and area closures based upon historical bycatch trends.

Past and current actions to set or reduce PSC limits of halibut and salmon in North Pacific groundfish fisheries are listed below. Rationalization programs, which provided enhanced tools for maximizing catches while minimizing costs, also included measures to reduce bycatch of PSC species in fisheries and/or fishing sectors (e.g., gear type, vessel category) in which they occurred. Recent bycatch reduction programs include 1) Chinook salmon in the Bering Sea (BS) pollock fishery; 2) chum salmon in the Bering Sea pollock fishery; 3) Chinook salmon in the GUI of Alaska (GOA) pollock fishery; 4) Chinook salmon in the GOA non-pollock fishery; and 5) Pacific halibut in the GOA groundfish fisheries. Managers are scheduled to receive reports in June 2014 on the use of Pacific halibut PSC in the Bering Sea/Aleutian Islands (BSAI) groundfish fisheries.

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#### Conclusions

Current discussions include developing management tools for improving incentives for Chinook salmon and Pacific halibut PSC reduction and management; these tools may include PSC allocations to voluntary cooperatives. Potential PSC reductions and management incentives also may be considered for salmon and halibut PSCs in the BSAI groundfish fisheries.

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
