Monthly Highlights

- Website page views rose for the third month in a row. Our website was viewed 395,705 times in March 2018, up from 382,660 in March 2018. This is our best three-month total in the last three years.
- Instagram continues to set new records. We now have more than 65,000 total followers and the account is set to become our most popular social media channel to date, surpassing Facebook. The ARMS Biodiversity video was viewed 428,920 times in April and liked 5,334 times – our highest total ever.
- World Fish Migration Day was a big success. A number of fish passage features made it into the top 10 (see below).


