PURPOSE

The purpose of this contract is to provide a reference document which the Council can use to evaluate the advantages and disadvantages of the various limited entry systems in effect throughout the world.

PRODUCT

The contractor shall produce a document which summarizes the limited entry programs that are currently applied to major common property fisheries throughout the world. Each program summary shall address the statutory authority upon which the program is based, the system used to administer the program, and the regulations which implement the program. If comprehensive studies of a program have been completed, the summary shall cité major findings of such studies. Of particular interest in this latter respect are statistical data indicating the effect that a program has had on participation, effort, income to fighermen, license values, investment in vessels and gear, and government revenues. If no studies of a program have been completed, the contractor shall present such data as is readily available from other sources.
