REPORT TO THE NORTH PACIFIC FISHERIES MANAGEMENT COUNCIL CONCERNING COAST GUARD FCMA ENFORCEMENT

- 1. Recent FCMA Infractions. One report of violation (civil penalty procedure) and four citations (written warnings) have been issued since the last council meeting. In addition, two foreign fishing vessels have been seized for FCMA infractions. A brief summary of each infraction follows.
- a. 23 May. The Japanese factory vessel SHIKISHIMA MARU was issued a citation by USCGC JARVIS for failure to properly maintain the daily cumulative catch log.
- b. 29 May. The Japanese long liner EIKYU MARU No. 82 was issued a report of violation by USCGC STORIS for failure to maintain an accurate daily cumulative catch log. The boarding party uncovered an approximate 10 percent under logging.
- c. OI June. The South Korean stern trawler DAI HO No. 303 was issued a citation by USCGC MIDGETT for failure to properly fill out its copy of the 1979 fishing permit.
- d. 04 June. The Japanese stern trawler KAIYO MARU No. 53 was seized by USCGC STORIS for significant under logging of its catch and possession of prohibited species. (Enclosure 1)
- e. 07 June. The Soviet stern trawler KAZALINSK was issued a citation by USCGC JARVIS for failure to report a shift in statistical area and illegible International Radio call sign.
- f. 15 June. The Soviet stern trawler TURKUL was issued a citation by USCGC MIDGETT for failure to properly maintain the daily cumulative catch log. CCL was maintained for trip rather than for permit period.
- g. 20 June. The South Korean long liner DONG WON No. 31 was seized by USCGC MUNRO for significant under logging of its catch. (Enclosure 2)

KAIYO MARU NO. 53 SEIZURE

The Japanese medium stern trawler KAIYO MARU No. 53 boarded by USCGC STORIS approximately 11 miles Southwest of Rat Island in the Aleutian Island chain on 02 June. In the course of the inspection a general under logging was initially discovered by comparing the volumn of fish onboard and that reflected in the vessels daily cumulative catch log. Further inspection revealed a gross under logging (estimate 240 MT processed weight vs 186 MT recorded round weight) plus at least one ton of halibut frozen in the holds. The vessel was subsequently seized for violation of 16 USC 1859 and escorted to Kodiak. The custody of the vessel was turned over to the U.S. Marshall. A physical inventory of the vessels catch was done by NMFS. The inventory result showed an overall 57% underlogging of catch with significant underlogging of pop, other rock fish, and squid. Pollack and flounders were over logged. dition, 11.57 MT of frozen halibut was in the hold. The case awaits prosecution by the U.S. Attorney in Anchorage.

DONG WON NO. 31 SEIZURE

1. The South Korean long liner DONG WON No. 31 was boarded by USCGC MUNRO approximately 50 miles Southwest of Icy Bay in the Gulf of Alaska on 20 June. A joint Coast Guard/NMFS boarding party uncovered a significant under logging of the vessels catch. The master knowingly logged processed weight in the daily cumulative catch log resulting in an approximate 65 ton under reporting of its sablefish catch. The boarding also revealed approximately 40.8 tons of incidental catch (both retained and discarded) that had not been reproted to NMFS. The vessel was seized for violation of 16 USC 1857 and escorted to Kodiak. Custody of the vessel has been turned over to the U.S. Marshall and the case awaits prosecution by the U.S. Attorney.
