




Gray Snapper (Lutjanus griseus aka mangrove snapper)

<u>Range:</u> widely distributed in western Atlantic from Florida to Brazil, the Caribbean, and the northern Gulf of Mexico

<u>Spawning times:</u> spawn during summer (May - Sept) in offshore waters around structured reef habitats

<u>How long they live</u>: most common gray snapper ages for recreational fishery were 5-12 years with maximum of 28 years

When they are sexually mature: 6.5-7in SL between 2 and 3 years of age




Life History Conceptual Model:









Gray Snapper (Lutjanus griseus aka mangrove snapper)



Sea surface temperatures in the adult range (Northern Gulf of Mexico)






Average annual landings by state (1980-2015) Commercial landings (In millions of Ibs) (245) (255) (245) (255

Potential influence of red snapper fishery:



Sudden decreases in access to red snapper (such as the reductions in season length from 2007 to 2008 and 2013 to 2014) may cause short-term increases in targeting of other snapper species, such as gray snapper.
