Report To The North Pacific Fishery Management Council Concerning U. S. Coast Guard MFCMA Enforcement

- 1. U. S. Coast Guard enforcement effort. U. S. Coast Guard enforcement effort for 1984 has totaled 225 cutter patrol days and 1243 aircraft patrol hours for over 210,021 miles. Combined aircraft and cutter enforcement efforts have resulted in twenty-one reports of violation and twenty-one citations. No foreign fishing vessels have been seized through U.S. Coast Guard effort in 1984. Additional patrol effort analysis is included in the enclosures.
- 2. Recent MFCMA infractions. Since the last council meeting Coast Guard enforcement effort has resulted in three reports of violation (civil penalty procedures) and four citations (written warnings) issued to foreign fishing vessels. The following summaries briefly describe the major infractions and enforcement activity.
- a. In April, CCGDSEVENTEEN (oil) issued citations to the Japanese vessels HATSUE MARU NO. 68 and TENKAI MARU for failure to submit the required activity message twenty-four hours prior to ceasing fishing activity while checked into the Fishery Conservation Zone.
- b. 19 April. USCGC SWEETBRIER issued a citation to the Japanese transport vessel SANYO MARU for failure to properly display its International Radio Call Sign (IRCS).
- c. 19 April. USCGC JARVIS issued a report of violation to the Japanese transport vessel SHUYO MARU for failure to maintain the readability of its International Radio Call Sign (IRCS).
- d. 22 April. USCGC BOUTWELL issued a citation to the Taiwanese stern trawler GOLDEN DRAGON NO.1 for failure to properly display its 1984 foreign fishing vessel permit form in the wheelhouse.

- e. 24 April. USCGC YOCONA issued a report of violation to the South Korean stern trawler PUNG YANG HO for failure to immediately return its catch of prohibited species, halibut, to the sea.
- f. 27 April. USCGC BOUTWELL issued a report of violation to the Japanese longliner SUMIYOSHI MARU NO. 53 for failure to maintain the accuracy of its daily cumulative catch log (DCCL). The inaccuracy resulted in a total underlog of approximately seven metric tons for all species.
