### **ACTION REQUIRED**

(a) Review tasking and provide direction.

### BACKGROUND

The list of Council Committees is attached under <u>Item D-2(a)</u>. The Steller Lion Mitigation Committee will meet April 26<sup>th</sup> at the Alaska Fisheries Science Center, and the Fur Seal Committee will be meeting via teleconference in the next month or so, but no date has been set.

Item D-2(b) is a three-meeting outlook, and Item D-2(c) is a summary of current staff tasking. As we discussed in February, a few projects have been delayed or put on hold while the NMFS and Council staff focus on analyzing and implementing Congressionally mandated programs (BSAI crab rationalization, and AI pollock allocation), and other major issues (GOA rationalization, IRIU, Observer Program, HAPC). Some staff time should become available after the April meeting (Jane will be back in our office, and Diana Evans is finishing up with the PGSEIS), so we can begin work on some of the 'back-burner' projects. These projects may include: administrative changes to the halibut subsistence program, repeal of the vessel incentive program, non-target species, SR/RE retention, and IFQ program changes (likely with contract assistance). The Council may want to provide guidance on prioritizing projects for tasking.



### **April 2004 Staff tasking**

The following actions were approved for analysis at the October (subsistence) and December (IFQ) 2003 Council meetings. Council and NMFS staff planned to package the actions as follows. The Council may wish to prioritize individual actions and reorganize the packages to reflect the new prioritization.

<u>Subsistence halibut fishery.</u> The following actions from the April 2002 preferred alternative were rescheduled for action in October 2004<sup>1</sup>.

- Action 1. 10 hooks and 20 fish annual limit in Kodiak road zone and Chiniak Bay
- Action 2. 10 hooks and no annual limit in Prince William Sound
- Action 3. 10 hooks and no annual limit in Cook Inlet
- Action 4. revise daily subsistence halibut limits in these areas to address rockfish and ling cod bycatch

The Council also initiated new analyses of the following proposed for review and action in 2004.

- Action 1. Possession limits equal to daily bag limits
- Action 2. Adopt the State of Alaska definition of charter vessels to enhance enforcement of prohibition of their use for subsistence halibut fishing
- Action 3. Revise the \$400 customary trade limit to either \$100 or no cash trade
- Action 4. Revise the proposed 3 permit stacking limit to either 1 or 2 per vessel.
- Action 5. Add a ceremonial, cultural, or educational harvest permit system in non-subsistence use areas by Alaska Native Tribes whose traditional fishing grounds are located within these areas. The permit would be limited to a harvest of 20 fish per day.

<u>Commercial halibut and sablefish individual fishing quota fisheries.</u> In December 2003, the Council approved the following actions for analysis. No timeline was set for action.

### **ADMINISTRATIVE ANALYSIS:**

Action 1. Amend regulations to allow medical transfers

- Alternative 1. No action.
- Alternative 2. Allow medical transfers.

### Action 2. Amend QS use rights/hired skipper provisions

- Alternative 1. No action.
- Alternative 2. Tighten the criteria for the 20 percent ownership requirement (ownership is documented by contemporary abstract of title).
- Option 1. Document 20% ownership by contemporary abstract of title continuously for previous:
  - 1. 12 months
  - 2. 24 months
  - 3. year-to-date plus previous calendar year; and/or
- Option 2. A vessel is limited to a maximum of 5 QS holders who may hire a skipper(s) on that vessel in the previous:
  - 1. 12 months
  - 2. 24 months
  - year-to-date plus previous calendar year

<sup>1</sup> Staff note: data from the ADFG survey is not expected to be available until October 2004, so this action is recommended to be rescheduled for December 2004, at the earliest.

Action 3. Amend check-in/check out requirements

Alternative 1. No action.

Alternative 2. Add check-in/check out and/or VMS requirements to the BS and AI sablefish regulations.

Option 1. Add check-in/check-out for the Aleutian Islands and Bering Sea sablefish fishery (e.g., in Dutch Harbor, Adak, St Paul, St George)

Option 2. Require VMS when fishing in the Aleutian Islands and Bering Sea sablefish fishery

Action 4. Amend sablefish product recovery rate

Alternative 1. No action.

Alternative 2. Change product recovery rate from 0.98 to 1 for bled sablefish.

### **ALLOCATIVE ANALYSIS:**

Action 1. Amend halibut block program in Areas 2C, 3A, 3B, 4A, 4B, 4C, and 4D
