REPORT TO THE NORTH PACIFIC FISHERIES MANAGEMENT COUNCIL CONCERNING COAST GUARD FCMA ENFORCEMENT

- 1. Recent FCMA Infractions. Three reports of violation (civil penalty procedures) and six citations (written warnings) have been issued since the last council meeting. A brief summary of each infraction follows.
- a. 22 January. USCGC MIDGETT issued a report of violation to the Soviet factory ship SULAK for underlogging herring. The SULAK was also issued citations for failure to log prohibited species and failure to log discards.
 - b. 26 January. USCGC MIDGETT issued a citation to the Taiwanese stern trawler HIGHLY 302 for failure to discard prohibited species (halibut) in a timely manner.
 - c. 27 January. USCGC STORIS issued a citation to the South Korean stern trawler HEUNG YANG HO for failure to submit a fisheries area shift message.
 - d. 28 January. USCGC CONFIDENCE issued a citation to the Japanese longliner MITO MARU NR 82 for an unsafe boarding ladder.
 - e. 29 January. USCGC MIDGETT issued a report of violation to the South Korean stern trawler. KYUNG YANG HO for underlogging 28.6 metric tons of pollock in her daily cumulative catch log.
- f. Ø3 February. USCGC MIDGETT issued a report of violation to the Japanese stern trawler KAIUN MARU NR 65 for entering processed rather than round weight in her daily cumulative catch log and for failure to log discards. The KAIUN MARU NR 65 was also issued a citation for maintaining her catch log as a weekly rather than as a daily cumulative catch log.
