The North Pacific Fishery Management Council will meet in Anchorage, Alaska, December 10-13 at the Anchorage Westward Hilton Hotel. The meeting will begin at 9:00 a.m. on Tuesday, December 10, and may continue into Saturday, December 14. The Council will make final decisions on groundfish harvest levels for 1986 and their apportionments to U.S. and foreign fisheries. will also consider whether to accept an offer from the Secretary of Commerce to publish a September 26, 1985, or some other, cut-off date for any further credit for entry into the sablefish hook and longline fishery in the Gulf of Alaska should there be a limited access system developed for that fishery. The Council will review foreign allocations, vessel permits and joint venture operations for 1986 and consider industry solutions to the problem of king crab bycatch in joint venture trawl operations. There will be reports on domestic and foreign fisheries and Coast Guard enforcement activities. Advisory Panel appointments for the coming year will also be announced, and the Council will review action for reauthorization of the MFCMA.

The Council's Permit Review Committee will convene on Sunday, December 8, at 1:00 p.m. to review foreign allocations, vessels permits and joint venture applications for 1986. This meeting will probably continue into Monday, December 9.

The Scientific and Statistical Committee will begin on Sunday at 11:00 a.m., and the Advisory Panel will begin at 9:00 a.m. on Monday, December 9. Other plan team, committee and workgroup meetings may be held on short notice during the week. Except for a closed meeting which will be scheduled to discuss personnel matters and to hear a report containing classified material from the State Department, all meetings are open to the public. All meetings will be held at the Anchorage Westward Hilton.

INFORMATION FOR PERSONS WISHING TO TESTIFY AT COUNCIL MEETINGS

Those wishing to testify at Council meetings on a specific agenda item must fill out and deposit a registration card in the box on the registration table before public comment begins on that agenda item. - DAP Domestic Annual Processed catch by U.S. vessels delivering to U.S. processors and by U.S. catcher/processors.
- JVP Joint Venture Processed catch by U.S. fishing vessels delivering to foreign processing vessels.

- TAC Optimum Yields and Total Allowable Catches are annual harvest levels based on biological, economic and social factors.
- PSC Prohibited Species Catch is a harvest limit usually placed on halibut, salmon and crabs or other species which must be discarded in the groundfish fisheries (except for halibut by U.S. hook and line vessels during halibut openings).
- TALFF- Total Allowable Level of Foreign Fishing
