The Council will meet in executive session at noon on Wednesday. All other meetings are open to the public.

MAIN ISSUES

Of the items requiring Council attention in April, the following are expected to involve the most discussion and public comment:

<u>Future Fisheries Management</u> (Agenda C-5)

The Council will revisit, and may confirm, the proposed January 16, 1989 cut-off date for participation in the groundfish fisheries off Alaska and discuss criteria for determining vessels already in the process of entering the fishery. The Council will hear reports on the progress of their Fisheries Planning Committee in defining problems and concerns in the fisheries and developing controlled-access alternatives for sablefish, halibut, other groundfish and crab. The Council will hold a scoping session on Thursday afternoon, April 13, to take testimony on issues and concerns for future management of these fisheries.

Comprehensive Data Gathering Program (Agenda C-6)

The Council will approve for public review a proposed amendment to the groundfish fishery management plans to implement a comprehensive data gathering program. This amendment will consist of two parts, a recordkeeping/reporting requirements section, and a domestic observer program. The program is designed to provide the inseason management, economic, and biological data required by the Council and Secretary of Commerce.

Requests for Immediate Council Action on Groundfish (Agenda C-7)

The Council will consider requests from industry to take emergency action to prohibit roestripping and require full utilization of pollock of all groundfish by 1990. The Council also will review a request to permit retainable pollock bycatch in other Gulf of Alaska groundfish fisheries for the rest of 1989.

Salmon Fishery Management Plan (Agenda D-1)

An updated fishery management plan (FMP) for salmon in the Exclusive Economic Zone off Alaska will be considered for public review. The plan incorporates changes to fishery management as a result of the Pacific Salmon Treaty, recognizes the management role of both the Pacific Salmon Commission and the Alaska Board of Fisheries, and defers leadership to these bodies while maintaining federal oversight.

Groundfish Fishery Management Plans (Agenda D-2)

The Council will approve for public review proposed amendments to the Bering Sea and Aleutian Islands Groundfish FMP and the Gulf of Alaska Groundfish FMP. Proposed amendments to the FMPs include:

- (1) Allocate sablefish total allowable catch and domestic annual processed catch (DAP) to gear types in the Bering Sea/Aleutian Islands.
- (2) Establish a framework for setting fishing seasons for all groundfish species in the Gulf of Alaska and Bering Sea/Aleutian Islands.
- (3) Establish a Shelikof District in the Central Regulatory Area of the Gulf of Alaska.
- (4) Establish a groundfish fishing closed zone near the Walrus Islands and Cape Pierce in the Bering Sea/Aleutian Islands.
- (5) Replace the king crab protection time/area closures around Kodiak Island and modify the halibut bycatch management regime for the Gulf of Alaska.
- (6) Extend the Pacific cod trawl fishery exemption area in the Bering Sea/Aleutian Islands from approximately 25 fathoms to 30 fathoms.
- (7) Clarify Secretary's authority to split or combine species groups within the target species management category by a framework procedure for the Gulf of Alaska and Bering Sea/Aleutian Islands.

The Council is also scheduled to approve a regulatory amendment that will redefine directed fishing for groundfish in the Bering Sea and Aleutians and trawl-caught sablefish in the Gulf of Alaska.
