SUMMARY NORTH PACIFIC FISHERY MANAGEMENT COUNCIL SEVENTEENTH PLENARY SESSION July 26-27, 1978

The regular meeting of the North Pacific Fishery Management Council was held in Anchorage, Alaska at the Captain Cook Hotel. The Scientific and Statistical Committee of the Council met on Wednesday, July 26th and again on Thursday, July 27th at the Council offices in the Post Office Mall Building. The Advisory Panel met on July 26th in the Easter Island Room of the Captain Cook Hotel and again on Friday the 28th. In addition, both these groups met concurrently with the Council during the meetings.

The closed session which had been advertised was not held. A public hearing was held Thursday, July 27th starting at 3:30 p.m.

The following is a summary of the highlights of the meeting:

HIGH SEAS SALMON (TROLL) FMP

The Council approved, after considerable debate, the revised draft FMP to go forward for public comment. The plan will offer a number of possible ways of attaining the Council's objective in the Southeastern Alaska troll salmon fishery, which is to stabilize the catch at the average level of the past seven years. Limited entry in the offshore fishery, quotas and combining offshore and state catches will all be open for comment. Copies of the plan should be available for distribution by late August.

BERING SEA GROUNDFISH FMP

The Council approved the draft of the Bering Sea/Aleutian Groundfish Plan to go forward to public hearings. The FMP with its accompanying Draft Environmental Impact Statement is expected to be ready for public distribution by late August.

8. COUNCIL RESEARCH CONTRACTS - REPORTS

a. Contract #78-1, "An Investigation of Joint U.S./Foreign

Ventures in the Developing Commercial Fishery Off Alaska"

First considered at the June Council meeting but not considered acceptable by the SSC, this report has subsequently been reviewed by an SSC subcommittee. We have extended the final date of the contract to August 15, 1978. If the final report is in hand after review by the review group and the SSC, the Council needs to accept or reject the report and authorize final payment.

b. Interim report on Contract #78-4, "The Development and Enhancement of a Computerized Fisheries Information System."

The interim report was mailed to members of the SSC and needs only passing attention by the Council. A major review of the contract is scheduled for October of this year to assess first year activities and plan the second year Statements of Work, Goals and Objectives.

c. Interim report by Dames & Moore for Contract #78-6, "A Study
of the Social and Economic Impacts of a Commercial Herring
Fishery on the Villages and Residents of the Arctic/Yukon/
Kuskokwim (AYK) Area in Western Alaska."

It has been given to the Advisory Panel, SSC, and the Herring Steering Committee (consisting of western Alaska residents) for their review. Due to the sensitive and complex nature of the subsistence issue in western Alaska, review of the interim report by these groups is important. Because of the preliminary status of the raw data in the report, we have prohibited duplication, distribution, or citing any part of the report without written permission from the Council. In addition, we have requested that all comments and review of the Interim Report be sent directly to the Council for distribution to Dames & Moore.

d. First interim report from Tetra Tech, Inc., for Contract #78
10, "A Study to Determine the Effects of Hydraulic Clam Harvesting in the Eastern Bering Sea."

It deals primarily with the literature search and was received in advance of the scheduled date due.

9. REPORT ON MANAGEMENT PLAN DEVELOPMENT (MONTHLY UPDATE).

We have instituted a regular monthly update of all Council FMP's.

The report is in your agenda folder, and indicates ongoing work for nine FMPs and degree of progress in the development/review process, meetings held and planned, and any special problems.

10. APPOINT COUNCIL STEERING COMMITTEE FOR BERING SEA SHRIMP FISHERY
MANAGEMENT PLAN

A Council subcommittee needs to be appointed for the Bering Sea shrimp fishery management plan to assist the management plan drafting team in formulating objectives based on Council policy and in the review process of the FMP prior to submission to the Council.

11. OBSERVER REPORTS AND UPDATE ON JAPANESE LONGLINE PACIFIC COD FISHERY WEST OF 157° WEST LONGITUDE

Contained in your folder are the observer reports and the updated

fishery statistics on the Japanese longline Pacific cod fishery west of 157° West longitude.

12. REVIEW BERING SEA GROUNDFISH FMP AND REVISE FOR PUBLICATION

You received a copy of the Bering Sea Groundfish FMP in the mail. The Council should make a decision at this meeting to approve, with revisions as necessary, the plan for printing and publication to begin the public comment period and public hearings. In your agenda folder is a memorandum detailing the central points of the plan.

13. REVIEW HIGH SEAS SALMON (TROLL) FISHERY MANAGEMENT PLAN AND REVISE

In your agenda folder is a much abbreviated summary of the important parts of the High Seas Salmon (Troll) FMP. If approved at this Council meeting for printing and subsequent public review, the earliest date the plan could be implemented is approximately April 15, 1979. If there is a delay, and the plan is not approved for printing at this time, it is doubtful whether the FMP could be implemented for the 1979 fishery. At best it is a tight schedule.

The summary covers the sections on MSY, OY, Management Options, Management Objectives, limited entry, and Council objectives.

Council review should insure that every possible option or alternative is listed in the plan so that whatever is finally approved, the public has had a chance to comment.

14. HALIBUT FISHERY MANAGEMENT PLAN: COUNCIL DIRECTION FOR FIRST-YEAR
OBJECTIVES

The Halibut Management Plan development team and the Council Steering Committee met in Seattle this month to discuss and begin a fishery management plan for halibut. Harold Lokken will report on the status of the U.S./Canada talks as they relate to halibut. We expect a first draft of the halibut FMP by the August 24 Council meeting.

15. PRELIMINARY FOREIGN FEE SCHEDULE FOR 1979

We have asked the Advisory Panel to review this schedule and make their recommendations to the Council. There is another national meeting scheduled to finalize the Fee Schedule in September, date and location undecided at this time.

16. CONSIDER IMPLEMENTING GULF OF ALASKA GROUNDFISH FISHERY FMP THROUGH 1979.

We have been asked by NOAA to comment on three possible alternatives for implementing the Gulf of Alaska Groundfish FMP. These alternatives, included in your agenda folder, suggest we either implement the plan as is for the 12-months following the implementation date, or implement the plan for 12 months beginning January 1, 1979.
