Other meetings may be held on short notice. Though the Council will meet in executive session at least once during the week to review ongoing litigation and foreign affairs, all other meetings are open to the public. All will be held at the Kodiak Community College unless otherwise noted.

MAIN ISSUES

Of the items requiring Council attention in June the following are expected to involve the most discussion and public comment:

Magnuson Act Amendments

The industry Americanization Committee will report its recommendations on ways to fully develop the U.S. groundfish fisheries. Based on these recommendations and other considerations, the Council may propose changes to the Magnuson Fishery Conservation and Management Act.

Joint Venture Policy Revisions

The Council will receive recommendations from its Permit Review Committee on joint venture policy for 1987. The Committee will recommend that joint ventures fish target species from a pool and that bycatch guidelines be established by company for fully utilized and prohibited species. If the Council accepts these recommendations, the 1987 fishery will be conducted the same as it was this year.

Salmon FMP

The Council will review its future role in managing Alaska salmon fisheries. The five options published for public comment were:

- 1. Withdraw the FMP (and federal management).
- 2. Make minor revisions to the FMP but not substantive changes.
- 3. Delegate management authority to the State (this still requires an FMP).
- 4. Make major changes to make the FMP current and provide greater federal management flexibility.
- 5. Close the Fishery Conservation Zone (FCZ) to all salmon fishing.

The comment period on these alternatives ended June 10.

Tanner Crab & King Crab FMPs

We have been told by NMFS that they will follow through on the Council's recommendation to suspend the Tanner crab regulations. We also expect a letter from Governor Sheffield declining the delegation of federal management authority for king crab through the Council's framework FMP. The Council will have to decide the kind and timing of action on both crab FMPs.

Groundfish Issues

Draft revisions to the Gulf of Alaska Groundfish FMP are scheduled to be approved for public review. The Council may include some or all of the revisions originally proposed as Amendment 15. These revisions change major sections of the plan and framework management measures that set harvest levels, field order authority, and level and handling of bycatch. The Council will also consider adding the recommendations of an industry workgroup on Kodiak trawl/king crab problems to the amendment. Final decisions on the amendment will be made in September.

The Council expected to approve Amendment 10 to the Bering Sea and Aleutian Islands groundfish plan for Secretarial Review. The amendment expands field order authority, places controls on bycatch, and provides priority access for DAP fisheries. However, it is probable that a more specific, modified version of the amendment will have to be developed by the Council because NMFS has said the frameworked measures now proposed are too general to pass legal review. The Council will also review the history of trawl restrictions in the Bristol Bay Pot Sanctuary and the emergency restrictions and observer requirements for U.S. domestic trawlers in the Eastern Bering Sea.
