Executive Director's Report

Annual Chairmen and EDs meeting

In late May Chairman Benton and I attended the annual Council Chairmen's meeting hosted by the Gulf of Mexico Council (we will be hosting next year's meeting, either in Homer in July or Sitka in May). The Council Chairs and Executive Directors met for a day and a half, followed by a day and a half meeting with NOAA/NMFS representatives, including Bill Hogarth, Clarence Pautzke, Jim Balsiger, and numerous others from the agency. Attached (B-1(a)) is the agenda from the meeting to give you an idea of the breadth of topics discussed. Foremost for the Council discussions were Magnuson-Stevens Act reauthorization issues, which I will describe in further detail under agenda item C-9 later this week. Specific issues of high interest included: the NEPA process and, related to that, how to better streamline our process; EFH, and the desire to obtain more specific guidance from Congress on their intent with regard to defining and protecting EFH (or HAPC); the recent Executive Order regarding Marine Protected Areas (MPAs) and how that process relates to the Council process, particularly in defining and designating MPAs; and, the moratorium on IFQs. Of additional interest is the 2002 proposed budget, which includes an additional \$2.5 million for the eight Regional Councils (of which we receive about 16%). Other than special funding for AFA and Steller sea lions, we have been level-funded for the past three years.

Evening Events and Meetings

There are several evening sessions taking place this week. On Monday and Tuesday we had an EFH scoping meeting and an Ecosystem Committee meeting respectively. Tonight there will be a Community Reception at the Near Island Research Facility, at 6:00 pm. Tomorrow night, in this room, there are two presentations that should be of interest to Council members and everyone else in our process. At 5:30 pm (or immediately following the Council's evening recess) Mark Buckley, Manager of the Digital Observer Project, will make a presentation on video monitoring systems they are developing as a potential supplement to onboard observers. This is an interesting presentation which was given to our SSC at the April meeting. Mr. Buckley's letter, under B-1(b), requests that staff initiate the process of regulatory changes to permit the acceptance of data provided by video monitoring systems. My informal response was that this is likely something that needs to be discussed and closely coordinated between the Council and NMFS prior to such a regulatory change.

Following that presentation, at about 6:15 pm, there will be a robotic camera demonstration from a representative of Seymour Wildlife Systems. This should also be of high interest to the Council and industry as these types of monitoring devices are playing an increasingly important role in Steller sea lion research.

Finance Committee and Executive Session

I have tentatively scheduled a meeting of the Finance Committee later this week to update you on our current budget, future budget outlook, and recent expenditures and commitments of our SSL funds. You may also want to hold an Executive Session to discuss the two letters under Item B-1(c) which relate to AP seats. One regards the AP seat vacated by Kim Dietrich, and the other regards the resignation of John Henderschedt.

New Senior Economist

I am pleased to announce that we have hired a new Senior Economist for the Council staff. Dr. Mark Fina, formerly with Northern Economics, Inc., has accepted an offer for this position and will start on July 15. This delay is to allow him some time to complete his commitments to Northern Economics, which include contract work for our Council. Mark holds a Ph.D. in Agricultural and Applied Economics from Virginia Polytechnic Institute, as well as a J.D. from the University of Minnesota Law School. Darrell Brannan will work for us through July to finish the AFA report to Congress and assist on some aspects of the SSL analysis. We also intend to hire an additional staff economist/analyst to round out the team. I have a couple of excellent candidates for that position and hope to fill it next week, likely with a mid-July or August start date.

Re: Regulatory change: Request to address AP & Council on Video Monitoring Systems

Dear Mr. Oliver: CHRIS

Thank you for meeting with me last week during a break in the Council meeting and for attending my project's April 10 presentation to the Scientific and Statistical Committee.

As you are aware, my project seeks to demonstrate that sophisticated video monitoring systems can supplement, and perhaps replace, many human observer functions aboard Alaska longliners. As i discussed in my SSC presentation, we are making

good progress toward achieving our technical goals.

But there is another, non-technical hurdle we must leap before we can offer industry the option of video monitoring systems aboard fishing vessels. There is today no regulatory mechanism that allows government to accept observer information provided by data-gathering and recording devices. Without regulatory change--no matter how successful the technology becomes--the deployment of video monitoring systems in lieu of human counterparts will never happen in Alaska.

To date the both the Council's Observer Advisory Committee and its SSC have gone on record in support of this project and of the concept of video monitoring in general. Dr. Dan Ito, director of NMFS's North Pacific Groundfish Observer Program, is on my project's Advisory Committee. Last year two consultant groups contracted by the NMFS Alaska region urged the agency to pursue the development of video monitoring. In essence, there is growing support for the concept.

• By this letter I am requesting the Council staff initiate the process of crafting regulations permitting the acceptance of data provided by video monitoring systems. I recognize that input from both the Council's Observer Advisory Committee and NMFS

will be integral to this agency review process.

• Additionally, I would like to make 30-minute presentations to both the AP and the full Council during the June meeting here in Kodiak. I plan to explain my project to those bodies and ask them for feedback and direction.

I look forward to your response to my requests as well as to working with you and the Council in the future.

The study area will be in the Central Gulf of Alaska within 150 miles of Kodiak Island.

This LOA is separate and distinct from any permit required by any other applicable law. In order to facilitate identification of your activities as scientific research, you should carry a copy of your scientific research plan and this LOA on board the research vessel while conducting scientific research activities. Generally, activities conducted in accordance with a scientific research plan as acknowledged by a LOA are presumed to be scientific research. This presumption may be overcome if it can be shown that an activity does not fit the definition of scientific research activity or is outside the scope of your scientific research plan.

It is anticipated that the research catch taken will be approximately 71 tons consisting primarily of sablefish, Pacific halibut, grenadiers, thornyhead rockfish, shortraker and rougheye rockfish, arrowtooth flounder and other groundfish. All Pacific halibut will be returned to the sea after sampling and measurements have been taken. The chief scientists and vessel captain must

identify all fish retained and processed during the research operations such that the research catch can easily be identified upon any vessel inspection. Since research catch does not come under the authority of Gulf of Alaska Groundfish Fishery Management Plan, it is not to be counted towards its commercial catch. I recommend that the Captain and the Chief Scientist document in writing the quantity of fish product retained on board during the period of the scientific research operations.


