# ALASKA DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND GAME REPORT TO THE NORTH PACIFIC FISHERY MANAGEMENT COUNCIL DECEMBER, 2001

Fisheries managed under delegated authority of the State of Alaska since the last council report: salmon, crab, and groundfish.

# Salmon Troll Fishery

(FIGURE 1) The 2001 winter troll season for chinook salmon opened October 11, and will close April 15, 2002, or when 45,000 treaty chinook salmon are harvested, whichever occurs first. Approximately 60 trollers are presently fishing, and have harvested about 15,000 treaty chinook salmon to date.

#### Bristol Bay red king crab

(FIGURE 2) The Bristol Bay (Area T) red king crab fishery opened by regulation to commercial fishing by the open access fleet on October 15<sup>th</sup>. The Guideline Harvest Level (GHL) for the fishery was 6.6 million pounds. A total of 232 vessels made 237 landings, producing a final catch of about 7.79 million pounds.

The fishery was open for just under three and one half days. With an estimated exvessel value of \$4.81 per pound, the fishery was worth about \$37 million. The CDQ fishery occurred subsequent to the general fishery, with the last delivery made November 6<sup>th</sup>. Ten vessels made 15 landings, pursuing 7.5% of the Federal CDQ allocation.

### Aleutian Islands golden king crab

(FIGURE 3) The Aleutian Islands (Area O) opened to commercial fishing for golden king crab on August 15, 2001 with guideline harvest levels (GHL) of 3.0 million pounds east and 2.7 million pounds west of 174° W. longitude. That portion of Area O east of 174° W. longitude closed to commercial fishing on September 10<sup>th</sup>, when the GHL was reached. Fishing remains open West of 174° W. longitude, with about 6 to 8 vessels participating. Approximately 55% of that GHL remains to be taken.

### Aleutian Islands red king crab

The Aleutian Islands (Area O) opened to commercial fishing for red king crab on November 1, 2001, under conditions establish through a Commissioner's Permit. Permits were issued to assess a portion of the Western Aleutian Islands red king crab stock, primarily around the Petrel Bank area. Historical landings of red king crab in the Aleutians peaked in the mid 1960s at just less than 40 million pounds. Commercial fishing closed in the very early 1980s around the Dutch Harbor area, and the Adak area was closed in the mid 1990s. For 2001, four vessels made landing under very specific guidelines established with each permit. Catch data is confidential as only two buyers participated.

#### Bering Sea opilio crab

One of the items reviewed by the Alaska Board of Fisheries when they met in Anchorage in mid-November concerned four proposals (426, 427, 428, and 429) requesting a change in the season opening date for snow crab from January 15 to March 15, or April 1. After a lengthy discussion, the board voted to reject

proposal 426, and took no action on the others. Arguments for changing the season focused on weather-related safety and weather-related bycatch concerns. Arguments against changing the season included the allocative aspects concerning vessel size, and the possibility of continued fishing pressure occurring into the biological season when harvest guideline levels are high. The board concluded that any changes at this time could destabilize the fishery and disrupt fishermen's current plans to participate. The board also announced that, given action on these four proposals, the season dates for opilio would not be considered during the March 2002 board meeting.

#### Recent Alaska Board of Fisheries actions on groundfish fisheries

When the Alaska Board of Fisheries met in Anchorage in mid-November, another item under discussion was groundfish. The board adopted an amended proposal (#499) to create a new management plan for managing the parallel groundfish fisheries in state waters. The new regulation delegates authority to the commissioner to open and close seasons and areas in state waters by emergency order for Pacific cod, pollock, and Atka mackerel as necessary to match federal regulations that address fishing restrictions in state waters for the purpose of protecting Steller sea lions. Additionally, if the commissioner exercises this authority, two areas must be opened to pot gear (in addition to the already allowed jig gear): the area described in the federal fishery as the closed area surrounding the Cape Barnabas haul out, and the area described in the federal fishery as the closed are surrounding the Caton Island haul out. This regulation sunsets December 31, 2002. Another amended proposal (#407) that was adopted by the board dealt with opening the Pacific cod season in the Chignik area on March 1, 2002. This regulation sunsets December 31, 2002.

#### Central Region Pacific Cod

#### **Cook Inlet**

(FIGURE 4) The State managed Pacific cod fishery in the Cook Inlet Management Area opened 24 hours after the close of the Federal fishery. The 2001 Cook Inlet Area state managed season for Pacific cod opened on March 5 with a 1.92 million pound GHL allocated 50% to pot gear and 50% to jig gear. The GHL is calculated as 2.25% of the Acceptable Biological Catch (ABC) for the federal Central Gulf of Alaska Area. Pot gear closed by regulation on May 1 and reopened June 15 while jig gear remained open throughout the season. The current harvest level is about 800,000 pounds from 9 pot vessels. Jig vessel catches are just under 20,000 pounds by 5 boats. By regulation the exclusive area registration and gear limits were lifted October 30 and the fishery is expected to remain open the balance of the year.

#### **Prince William Sound**

The 2001 Prince William Sound (PWS) state managed Pacific cod season opened March 11 with a 2.62 million pound GHL allocated 60% to pot gear and 40% to jig gear. The GHL is calculated as 25% of the federal Eastern Gulf ABC. Harvest data from the fishery is confidential due to the low level of participation. By regulation the exclusive area registration and gear limits were lifted October 30 and the fishery is expected to remain open the balance of the year.

#### Westward Region Pacific Cod (FIGURE 5)

#### Kodiak (FIGURE 6)

The 2001 Kodiak Area GHL for state-managed Pacific cod is 10.6 million pounds. This is 12.5% of the Central Gulf of Alaska Acceptable Biological Catch (ABC) for cod. The guideline is split equally between pot and jig gear. Prior to September 1, vessels over 58 feet can take no more than 25% of the guideline. The fishery opened on March 11, seven days after the closure of the Central GOA to cod fishing. The 2001 fishery has taken 4.78 million pounds through November 27,

with 3.5 million pounds taken with pot gear and the remainder with jigs. There are currently 137 vessels registered to fish. The fishery is expected to remain open.

#### Chignik (FIGURE 7)

The 2001 Chignik area GHL is 6.0 million pounds for state-managed Pacific cod. This is 7% of the Central Gulf of Alaska ABC for cod. The guideline is allocated 85% to pot gear and 15% to jig gear. As stated previously, the Alaska Board of Fisheries recently adopted a proposal to change the opening date for next year. The season will now open on March 1, in order to take advantage of a cod buyer in the area. Again, this regulation will sunset December 31, 2002.

#### South Alaska Peninsula (FIGURE 8)

The 2001 South Alaska Peninsula Area GHL is 13.4 million pounds for state-managed Pacific cod. This is 25% of the Western Gulf of Alaska ABC for cod. The guideline is allocated 85% to pot gear and 15% to jig gear. The fishery opened March 6, seven days after the closure of the Western GOA to cod fishing. The fishery closed to pot gear on April 13, and to jig gear in early June. The pot harvest was 10.4 million pounds; the jig harvest was 3.0 million pounds. The fishery is closed for the remainder of 2001.

#### Southeast Groundfish

In the Northern Southeast Inside (NSEI) sablefish fishery 662,978 lbs was landed during this reporting period. The quota for Chatham is about 2.2 million pounds. The pot gear sablefish fishery in the Southern Southeast Inside (SSEI) fishery was ongoing also, but with only 3 permits reporting for this period, catch data is confidential. The quota for Clarence Strait is just under 700,000 pounds. The fishery for Demersal Shelf Rockfish opened for 24 hours on November 16<sup>th</sup>, and again on the 26<sup>th</sup>. Effort has been less than anticipated. A total of 27,708 lbs (12.6 mt) has been landed so far.



