



### 1995 BSAI CDQ POLLOCK





# 1993-95 INSHORE/OFFSHORE PLCK CATCH\*, BERING SEA




### 1994 AND 1995 BSAI ROCK SOLE CATCH




## 1995 BSAI GREENLAND TURBOT CATCH






## 1994 & 1995 BSAI FIXED GEAR PACIFIC COD CATCH






# 1995 BSAI TRAWL PACIFIC COD DISCARDS IN PCOD FISHERY



### 1995 BSAI PERCENT DISCARDS BY GEAR & TARGET FISHERY




## 1995 BSAI TRAWL HALIBUT BYCATCH MORTALITY




# 1994-95 BSAI TRAWL HALIBUT BYCATCH MORTALITY, PCOD




1995 BSAI ZONE 1 TRAWL RED KING CRAB BYCATCH




## 1995 BSAI ZONE 1 TRAWL, BAIRDI TANNER CRAB BYCATCH




## 1994-95 BSAI TRAWL, OPILIO TANNER CRAB BYCATCH







### MOTION

- (1) Fish harvested incidentally during the operation of a quota share/IFQ fishery shall be termed "bycatch species" for the purpose of the program. Bycatch species are defined as Pacific cod and rockfish.
- (2) Any bycatch species identified under (1) above which are taken during the operation of a QS or IFQ fishery shall be retained and landed unless designated as a prohibited species.

### REGULATION

§ 676.16 (h) It is unlawful for any person to discard Pacific cod or rockfish that are taken when IFQ halibut or IFQ sablefish are onboard unless Pacific cod or rockfish are required to be discarded under §§ 672.20 or 675.20.

Note: §§ 672.20 and 675.20 implement maximum bycatch rates to limit directed fishing, and mandatory discarding when species are designated as prohibited.


- (1) All species of rockfish were bycatch for Trawl gear until July 3.
- (2) Trawling in Western GOA(except midwater pollock) prohibited 9/1 to prevent overfishing of POP.
- (3) Central GOA Northern rockfish closed 7/18; reopened 10/1 with 866 mt remaining; closed 10/13; final catch reports show 859 mt overage.
- (4) Eastern GOA POP closed 7/9; reopened 10/13 with 950 mt remaining; closed 10/15.
- (5) The West GOA POP fishery and Central GOA northern rockfish fishery are the only two fisheries over TAC where directed fishing was conducted. Both overages are attributable to incorrect or missing information from industry about processor vessel location and target.

### Implications for 1996 management:


Central GOA 'other rockfish'. This category includes Yelloweye rockfish, which occurs as bycatch in the halibut IFQ fishery. The 1996 ABC is 1,170 mt. Setting the TAC at or just below that level should provide sufficient amounts to support bycatch needs.

Shortraker/Rougheye. Bycatch needs for shortraker/rougheye exceed the TAC in all areas of the GOA. No directed fisheries for shortraker/rougheye occur in the GOA. NMFS must prohibit retention of shortraker/rougheye when the TAC is reached. Shortraker/rougheye TACs will likely be reached during the summer trawl fisheries and retention of shortraker/rougheye will be prohibited.

### 1994 & 1995 CENTRAL GOA INSHORE PACIFIC COD CATCH




### 1994 & 1995 WESTERN GOA **INSHORE PCOD CATCH**

D - Deep Water Flatfish





# 1994 & 1995 GOA HOOK & LINE\* HALIBUT BYCATCH MORTALITY



## 1995 GOA SW & DW TRAWL HALIBUT BYCATCH MORTALITY




# 1995 GOA TRAWL, TANNER & RED KING CRAB BYCATCH

Dear Clarence,

At its September 1995 meeting the Council adopted Amendment 37 to the Fishery Management Plan for the Groundfish Fishery of the Bering Sea and Aleutian Islands Area (FMP). This amendment would authorize a non-pelagic trawl closure of a specified area of Bristol Bay to protect declining populations of red king crab. The Council intended to have this trawl closure effective by the beginning of the 1996 trawl season. Sufficient time does not exist to implement an amendment to the FMP by the opening of the trawl season on January 20, 1996. Therefore, NMFS intends to implement the trawl closure in 1996 under authority for inseason adjustments ("hot spot" closures). We further intend to follow up this action with proposed Amendment 37 that would authorize the trawl closure as adopted by the Council for 1997 and beyond.

Authority for inseason adjustments is limited to closure of the specified area and does not include authority to include other components of the Council's recommendation, such as changes in observer coverage requirements. As a result NMFS is implementing a modification of the Council's action for 1996.

The modified action will close to all trawling the portion of the Bering Sea specified in the Council action. The Council had recommended closing the specified area to bottom trawling only. However, allowing vessels with pelagic trawl gear to operate in this area would require the presence of observers onboard all vessels to monitor the crab performance standard. NMFS is prohibiting all trawling in the closure area for 1996 because the authority for the inseason action does not include provisions for



increasing observer coverage. NMFS intends to initiate implementation of Amendment 37 early in 1996.
