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Report To The North Pacific Fishery Management
Council Concerning U. S. Coast Guard MFCMA Enforcement

1. U. S. COAST GUARD ENFORCEMENT EFFORT FOR 1985. U. S. Coast Guard enforcement efforts for Calendar Year 1985, through 14 May, have totalled 291 cutter patrol days and 897 aircraft patrol hours for over 122,870 patrol miles. Combined enforcement efforts have resulted in the issuance of twenty reports of violation and forty-five written warnings. Additional patrol effort analysis is provided in the enclosures.
2. U. S. COAST GUARD INTERNATIONAL PACIFIC HALIBUT COMMISSION ENFORCEMENT EFFORT. U. S. Coast Guard enforcement effort for the 27-29 April IPHC halibut opening included twenty cutter patrol days and sixty-two aircraft patrol hours for over 7,763 miles patrolled. A total of nineteen IPHC boardings were conducted during this first opening. Two vessels were detected by patrol aircraft pulling their gear after the fishery closure.
3. RECENT MFCMA INFRACTIONS. Since the last report made to the council (24 March 1985), Coast Guard enforcement efforts have resulted in eleven reports of violation (civil penalty procedures) and twenty-six written warnings being issued to foreign fishing vessels. The following briefly summarizes the major infractions and enforcement activity:
 - a. In March, CCGDSEVENTEEN (oil) issued written warnings to the following vessels for failure to submit the required activity message twenty-four hours prior to beginning/ceasing fishing operations within the Fishery Conservation Zone: MAZURY; WORLD FONTAINE; ESTAVAO GOMES; FUJISHIO MARU; PROF. BOGUCKI; AND VEGA.
 - b. 14 March. USCGC MIDGETT issued a report of violation to the South Korean stern trawler NO. 303 DAI HO for failure to monitor channel 16 VHF/FM after being hailed by MIDGETT and a CG helicopter for a boarding.
 - c. 23 March. USCGC MIDGETT issued a report of violation to the Soviet stern trawler KLUCHEVSKOI for failure to properly maintain their Daily Cumulative Catch Log (DCCL).
 - d. 27 March. USCGC MIDGETT issued a report of violation to the South Korean stern trawler NO. 707 DAI HO for failure to monitor channel 16 VHF/FM after being hailed for a boarding.

e. 30 March. USCGC MUNRO issued a written warning to the Soviet stern trawler MYS OSIPOVA for failure to accurately maintain their DCCL.

f. In April, COGDSEVENTEEN (oil) issued written warnings to the following vessels for failure to submit the required activity message twenty-four hours prior to beginning/ceasing fishing operations within the Fishery Conservation Zone: KYOKUSHIN MARU; KALMAR; KAIYO MARU NO. 7; TOMI MARU NO. 81; CHIL BO SAN HO NO. 5; AQUARIUS; and ISHIKARI MARU.

g. 3 April. USCGC STORIS issued a report of violation to the South Korean transport vessel NO. 1 CHIL BO SAN for failure to accurately maintain their transfer log.

h. 5 April. USCGC STORIS issued three written warnings to the Soviet stern trawler DRUZBHA for failure to: properly submit vessel activity messages; log disposition of catch in their DCCL; and properly log prohibited species discards.

i. 6 April. USCGC STORIS issued a written warning to the Soviet stern trawler POGRANICHNIK STRELNIKOV for failure to properly submit vessel activity message.

j. 16 April. USCGC SHERMAN issued a written warning to the Japanese stern trawler HAMAYOSHI MARU NO. 63 for failure to accurately maintain their DCCL.

k. 20 April. USCGC MUNRO issued a written warning to the Soviet stern trawler PISATEL for failure to accurately maintain their DCCL.

l. 20 April. USCGC STORIS issued a written warning to the Japanese stern trawler TOMI MARU NO. 81 for failure to maintain the legibility of their International Radio Call Sign (IRCS).

m. 29 April. USCGC MUNRO issued a written warning to the Polish stern trawler AWIOR for failure to accurately report the amount of fish product on board which was caught outside the Fishery Conservation Zone when the vessel began fishing operations within the FCZ.

n. 29 April. USCGC MUNRO issued a written warning to the Polish stern trawler PARMA for failure to maintain the legibility of their IRCS.

o. 9 May. A CG HC-130 surveillance aircraft detected nine Soviet stern trawlers east of the US/USSR Convention Line of 1867, within the FCZ. Five of these vessels were actively fishing. Written warnings were issued by Coast Guard Air Station Kodiak to those five vessels found fishing. This information has been referred to the Department of State for appropriate action.

n. 11 May. USCGC MUNRO issued a written warning to the Polish stern trawler AWIOR for failure to be in their stated cease position at the time indicated in their vessel activity message.

o. 12 May. USCGC JARVIS issued one report of violation and one written warning to the Japanese stern trawler SHOYO MARU for the following infractions: failure to accurately maintain their DCCL and failure to return prohibited species as soon as possible after retrieval of catch.

p. 13 May. USCGC JARVIS issued one report of violation and one written warning to the Japanese stern trawler KAIYO MARU NO. 7 for the following infractions: failure to maintain the legibility of their IRCS, and failure to display prescribed navigation lights and dayshape.

q. 13 May. USCGC JARVIS issued four reports of violation to the Japanese stern trawler RYUJIN MARU NO. 21 for failure to properly log the discard of pollock; one report of violation for failure to display prescribed navigation lights for a vessel engaged in trawling; and one written warning for failure to return prohibited species as soon as possible after retrieval of catch
