#### REPORT TO THE NORTH PACIFIC FISHERIES MANAGEMENT COUNCIL CONCERNING COAST GUARD FCMA ENFORCEMENT

- 1. Recent FCMA Infractions. Since the last council meeting eight reports of violation (civil penalty procedure) and two citations (written warning) have been issued for FCMA infractions. A brief summary of each infraction follows.
- a. 10 January. USCGC CONFIDENCE issued a report of violation to the Polish stern trawler DELFIN for retention of a prohibited species, salmon, in the fish hold; and, a citation for failure to properly maintain its daily cumulative catch log by logging whole fish going to meal under consumption rather than meal.
- b. 10 January. USCGC CONFIDENCE issued two reports of violation to the Polish stern trawler AMAREL for failure to properly maintain its daily cumulative catch log.
- c. 11 January. USCGC CONFIDENCE issued two reports of violation to the Polish stern trawler SATURN for failure to return prohibited species to the sea in a timely manner; and, failure to properly maintain its daily cumulative catch log by not logging incidental catches of Pacific cod.
- d. 12 January. USCGC CONFIDENCE issued two reports of violation to the Polish stern trawler SIRIUS for failure to return a prohibited species, salmon, to the sea in a timely manner; and, for failure to properly maintain its daily cumulative catch log by not logging incidental catches of Pacific cod.
- e. 15 January. USCGC CONFIDENCE issued a citation to the Polish stern trawler DENEBOLA for failure to properly maintain the transfer log by individual species.
- f. 16 January. USCGC CONFIDENCE issued a report of violation to the Polish stern trawler AMAREL for failure to log incidental catches of Pacific cod.
