

I. High Seas Drift Net Enforcement




Figure 1. High Seas Drift Net HC-130 Search Patterns

Operation Northern Watch continued through the reporting period, with 7 sorties and 57 hours flown by HC-130s (117 hours flown year to date, Figure 1). No suspicious vessels were sighted. The threat of drift net violations is expected to remain low for the remainder of the year.

II. US/Russian Maritime Boundary Line (MBL) Enforcement

Heavy foreign fishing on the RS side of the MBL continued to make the MBL a high priority for enforcement resources. CGC STORIS seized the FF/V PETROPAVLOVSK(RS) on 24 July for fishing 7 nm inside the US EEZ. The case settled for \$320K plus costs. See Appendix A for additional details. Figures 2-5 provide plots of foreign fishing vessel activity near the MBL. Figure 6 shows the trend in historic fishing effort along the MBL. For the reporting period, the following details apply:

- Coast Guard HC-130's flew 34 sorties totaling 285 hours.
- Coast Guard HEC/MECs spent 70 days patrolling the line.
- 6 vessels were observed in the US EEZ visually or by radar.
- 4 vessels were confirmed fishing in the US EEZ.
- FF/V PETROPAVLOVSK boarded by CG and seized (see App. A for details).
- FF/V KAPITAN MASLOVETS boarded by FBS and seized (see App. A for details).
- 2 vessels were not pursued due to no cutter being on site and Helo low on fuel.
- 2 vessels' activity could not be confirmed due to HC-130 low fuel and poor weather.

Figure 2. 27 JUN 01 MBL Scatter Plot of Aircraft Sightings




Figure 3. 17 JUL 01 MBL Scatter Plot of Aircraft Sightings




Figure 4. 30 AUG 01 MBL Scatter Plot of Aircraft Sightings





Figure 5. 10 SEP 01 MBL Scatterplot of Aircraft Sightings






Figure 6. 1998-2001 MBL Max Detections 0-20 NM in RS EEZ

III. Donut Hole

One foreign vessel FF/V Kai Tuo (PRC) conducted trial fishing in the Donut Hole during the period. Coast Guard boarded the Kai Tuo in June and reviewed the vessel's records. No discrepancies were found. No notices have been received for vessels scheduled to conduct trial fishing for the remainder of the year.

IV. Dixon Entrance Enforcement

Coast Guard enforcement efforts consisted of 72 patrol boat days and 20 HH-60J sorties from Air Station Sitka totaling 90 hours. There were no significant fisheries violations detected during the reporting period. However, 3 Canadian recreational vessels were boarded by the Coast Guard near Dixon Entrance and directed to depart U.S. waters for failure to clear U.S. Customs.

V. IFQ At-Sea/Dockside Enforcement

There was one significant violation during the reporting period. The F/V Kitty Fur II was detected fishing for halibut using longline gear 1.8 NM south of Stone Rock Bay, Prince of Wales Is. in Clarence Strait. Operator did not hold an IFQ permit and was not an IFQ quota shareholder. Operator was issued a citation and vessel was escorted to Ketchikan where it was turned over to NMFS enforcement and AST for further investigation. NMFS seized approximately 1,800 lbs of halibut.


In addition to the one significant violation, there were three dockside fisheries violations and three at-sea fisheries violations. One of the dockside violations was for retention of undersized halibut; the remaining two were for failure to carry IFQ permit on board and for using spiral/loose leaf notebooks instead of approved logbooks. Two of the at-sea violations were for failure to carry IFQ permits and the remaining was for not using an approved logbook.

Coast Guard effort consisted of the following:

- 106 IFQ at sea boardings (183 boardings year to date).
- 32 dockside offloads (114 dockside offloads year to date).
- 640.5 surveillance hours (1121 hours year to date). Data current as of 26 SEP 01



VII. CGD17 Boarding Statistics

The following charts show boarding and fishery violation trends over the last six years. CG IFQ dockside monitors were down this year as a direct result of the CG's increased efforts on afterhours surveillance. There was a slight increase in the number of domestic fisheries boardings over those during the same period last year, while the violation numbers and rate were both down. Figure 8. Boardings By Year



VIII. Steller Sea Lions and Critical Habitat Enforcement

The Coast Guard continued patrols of Steller Sea Lion Critical Habitat Areas. Cutters committed 1344 hours and aircraft committed 84 hours in support of this mission. No violations were detected.

X. Maritime Security

Following the 11 September terrorist attacks, the Coast Guard, working with federal and state agencies and industry, has tightened security on Alaska's waters to increase the safety of passengers, vessels, cargo, and terminals. The CG expanded vessel boardings, stepped up harbor patrols, is escorting certain ships carrying dangerous cargo, and broadening Coast Guard presence. Although the terrorist threat in Alaska may be low compared to other parts of our nation, the consequences are unacceptable.

The focus on Maritime Security has caused the Coast Guard to reduce its presence in other mission areas, including fisheries enforcement. Search and Rescue will remain at the forefront of our efforts, and the Coast Guard remains committed to maintaining a helicopter-equipped, high endurance cutter in the Bering Sea as an available Search and Rescue platform. The Seventeenth District currently does not know to what extent law enforcement operations will be reduced. However, we will continue to dedicate available resources to fisheries enforcement, including critical habitat surveillance and respond to reports of illegal activity.

The Coast Guard is also interested in reports of suspicious activity from the maritime community. Those involved in the fishing industry are particularly valuable to our Maritime Security mission. Mariners and industry personnel should report any suspicious persons or activity, including threats, unusual purchases, suspicious behavior, etc., to the nearest Coast Guard unit or to the local FBI Field Office.

Appendix A 2001 MARITIME BOUNDARY ACTIVITY

- O3 Jul A C-130 detected FF/V BAJENOVSK (RS) fishing 360 yards inside US EEZ and commenced hot pursuit. The vessel did not respond to hails and proceeded back across MBL into heavy fog. Photographs taken of vessel. Cutter was not available to continue pursuit.
- 24 Jul CGC STORIS detected FF/V PETROPAVLOSK (RS) by radar 14,000 yards inside the US EEZ. Vessel's fishing gear was observed in the water. Boarding team boarded vessel and observed 8-9 tons of processed Pollock on board, 2 tons unprocessed Pollock on deck in nets, 77 tons of salmon below deck and 22.4 tons of fish meal. Personnel from RBS patrol vessel, ASKOLD PYNKO boarded vessel and concurred with STORIS' findings. Vessel seized and towed (due to mechanical casualties) to Dutch Harbor for prosecution. Captain of the port order was issued and lifted following repair of casualties. Company settled for \$320K plus costs. Release pends.
- 24 Jul CGC MORGENTHAU detected FF/V BORODINO (RS) 1400 yards inside the US EEZ. Vessel's fishing gear was observed in the water by helo. Vessel ignored repeated orders to heave to. Helo dropped message block on vessel deck with same message and initiated hot pursuit. Vessel recovered its gear and proceeded back across MBL. Helo had to drop hot pursuit prior to handoff to cutter due to low fuel.
- 28 Aug CGC MORGENTHAU detected FF/V KAPITAN MASLOVETS (RS) 1000 yards in the US EEZ. Vessel's fishing gear observed in the water by helo. Helo ordered vessel to stop and dropped message blocks with same message. Hot pursuit handed over to CGC MORGENTHAU. Vessel recovered its gear and returned to RS EEZ with CGC MORGENTHAU in pursuit. Vessel continued into RS territorial seas. CGC MORGENTHAU maintained radar contact w/ vessel near Bukhta Ugolaya, RS. FBS vessel PAGELLA rendezvoused with CGC MORGENTHAU, reviewed case information and confirmed violation. FBS seized vessel. Case pends.
- 5 Sep A C-130 detected one vessel on radar approximately 2400 yards in the US EEZ. The aircraft had to return to Kodiak due to poor communication and low fuel prior to being able to confirm the activity of vessel (suspected incursion).
- 9 Sep CGC MIDGETT detected by radar and UPS plot a vessel 800 yards inside the US EEZ. Deepest incursion was 1000 yards. Vessel returned to RS EEZ before hot pursuit could be initiated. Further pursuit was not possible due to fog and uncertainty of vessel activity. Vessel was visually observed in the RS EEZ later and identified as FF/V SEONG KYUNG HO (KS). Issued verbal warning. Master denied he was fishing inside US EEZ. (suspected Incursion).

ENFORCEMENT REPORT FOR THE PERIOD 5/30/2001 THROUGH 9/28/2001

National Marine Fisheries Service Alaska Enforcement Division

During the period since the last Council meeting, the Alaska Enforcement Division has opened 441 new cases. We currently have 595 open cases. The cases have been a mix between observer coverage, IFQ, and record keeping and reporting of groundfish.

Special Note:

As a result of the terrorist activity, 29 of our 100 Special Agents nationwide have been assigned to the FBI to assist in investigations and executions of search warrants. Additionally, 21 agents may be tasked to serve as Sky Marshals until the permanent program is in place. We are not yet sure what impact this will be on our fisheries enforcement effort in Alaska.


We are also working with NOAA General Counsel to determine if we will ask for increased penalties for certain violations during this time period when enforcement activities are greatly impacted.


Investigative Highlights:


International Seafoods of Alaska, Inc. (ISA), which operates a fish processing facility in Kodiak, Alaska, plead guilty to a felony false-reporting charge in United States District Court in June. The company was charged in April 2001, by the United States Attorney's Office in Anchorage with one count of submitting a false report to the National Marine Fisheries Service. ISA agreed to pay a \$150,000.00 fine, with an additional \$46,000.00 (which represents the fair market value of all overages of fish received by the plant at it's Kodiak processing facility in January, February, and March of 1999) over a 5 year period of probation. Additionally, as a special condition of probation, ISA was ordered to place a public announcement at the company's expense in the "National Fisherman" for three consecutive months. This will acknowledge wrongdoing by the Corporation for submitting the false report, and emphasize the importance of accurate reporting as a fisheries management tool.




