U.S. COAST GUARD/NMFS JUNEAU FISHERIES ENFORCEMENT FOR PERIOD June 01, 1991 through August 31, 1991

1. ACCOMPLISHMENTS.

a. <u>Vessel Seizures:</u>

- (1) On June 25, USCGC STORIS seized the 161-foot American No. 1, the 106-foot Distant Water, and the 183-foot Bering Enterprise for fishing in the closed area around Round Island in Bristol Bay. The STORIS was acting on an anonymous tip to the National Marine Fisheries Service(NMFS). All three vessel's were escorted to Kodiak and turned over to the U.S. Marshal. The American No. 1 and Bering Enterprise posted bond of \$650,000 each and departed Kodiak. The Distant Water remains in Kodiak under custody of the U.S. Marshal.
- (2) On July 06, USCGC YOCONA seized the 110-foot stern trawler Vaerdal for illegally fishing in the Stellar sea lion rookery 10 nautical mile no trawl buffer zone north of Akun Island. YOCONA, acting on an anonymous tip, found numerous entries in the Vaerdal's Catcher/Processor Daily Cumulative Production Log(DCPL) showing incursions into the Akun Island zone and the Round Island closed fishing area. The vessel was escorted to Kodiak, turned over to the U.S. Marshal and released from custody on \$550,000 bond.
- (3) On July 14, USCGC ANACAPA seized the 38-foot Canadian troller Barbarella for illegally fishing in the waters of the state of Alaska 800 yards north of the Canadian claimed boundary(A-B line) in Dixon Entrance. The vessel was escorted to Ketchikan. On 19 July the Barbarella was released after agreeing to a settlement of \$5278.00.
- Canadian Purse Seiner Western Eagle for illegally fishing in the waters of the state of Alaska north of the Canadian claimed boundary (A-B line) in Dixon Entrance. ANACAPA was dispatched to the area after the Coast Guard received reports from U.S. fisherman that Canadian vessels were fishing north of the A-B line near Sitklan Island. When ANACAPA arrived in the area numerous fishing vessels were observed heading south to the Canadian side of the A-B line. The Western Eagle was sighted with purse seine gear in the water approximately 300 yards north of

the A-B line. The vessel was seized and escorted to Ketchikan. On 24 July the Western Eagle was released after agreeing to a settlement of \$5000.00.

- (5) On July 17, USCGC YOCONA seized the 267-foot trawler Royal Sea for fishing in the closed area around Round Island in Bristol Bay. The YOCONA boarding team found numerous entries in the Royal Sea's DCPL showing fishing in the closed area. The vessel was escorted to Kodiak and while enroute, on 19 July, released after agreeing to a settlement of \$300,000.
- (6) On July 17, USCGC BOUTWELL seized the 239-foot trawler Endurance for fishing in the closed area around Round Island in Bristol Bay. The BOUTWELL boarding team discovered numerous entries in the Endurance's DCPL showing fishing in the closed area. USCGC YOCONA assumed custody of the vessel from BOUTWELL and escorted it to Kodiak. On July 20, the Endurance was released after reaching settlement with the U.S. Attorney for \$400,000.
- (7) On July 27, USCGC LIBERTY seized the 36-foot Canadian troller Diane S for illegally fishing in the waters of the state of Alaska about 400 yards north of the Canadian claimed boundary(A-B line) in Dixon Entrance. LIBERTY escorted the vessel to Ketchikan and transferred custody to Group Ketchikan. On August 08 the vessel was released after reaching settlement for \$5000.00.
- (8) On September 04, USCGC YOCONA seized the 179-foot fishing vessel Bristol Enterprise for fishing in the closed area around Round Island in Bristol Bay. YOCONA's boarding team found numerous entries in the vessel's DCPL showing fishing in the closed area in June. YOCONA placed a custody crew aboard the vessel and directed it to Kodiak where custody was first transferred to Coast Guard Support Center Kodiak then the U.S. Marshal. On September 11 the Bristol Enterprise was released from custody after posting \$650,000 bond.
- (9) On September 07, the Coast Guard seized the 50-foot longliner Roseann Hess for halibut fishing after the September 03-04 halibut opening and for not conducting a continuous transit to port after the closure. USCGC VENTUROUS boarded the vessel off Chignik Bay after observing commercial fishing gear in the water near the Roseann Hess early on September 05. The boarding team observed numerous indications that the vessel had been fishing after the closure, including two halibut still moving 19 hours after the legal opening. The USCGC IRONWOOD escorted the Roseann Hess to Kodiak where the catch was sold and custody of the vessel was transferred to Coast Guard Support Center Kodiak. The case has been referred to the U.S. Attorney.
- (10) On September 10, USCGC YOCONA seized the 172-foot fishing vessel Concepcion for fishing in the closed area around Round Island in Bristol Bay. YOCONA's boarding team found

numerous entries in the vessel's DCPL showing fishing in the closed area in May and June. The YOCONA placed a custody crew aboard the vessel and directed it to Kodiak where custody was transferred to the Coast Guard Support Center. The case has been referred to the U.S. Attorney.

(11) On September 18, USCGC YOCONA, with assistance from a NMFS agent, seized the 136-foot longliner Yukon for failure to comply with observer and record keeping/reporting requirements. The vessel had been fishing in Alaskan waters since July 26, 1991 without an observer and had not submitted any reports to NMFS. In addition the vessel had retained prohibited species, Greenland Turbot and other Rockfish, on several occasions. The case has been referred to the U.S. Attorney.

b. Catch Seizures:

(1) On September 06, a Coast Guard Station Ketchikan utility boat crew seized the catch of the longliner Tristin Michael after they found 40 undersized halibut fillets and 20 undersized halibut. The catch was sold in Ketchikan by the Coast Guard and the case forwarded to NMFS.

c. Significant aircraft sightings:

(1) On June 30, a Kodiak based C-130 sighted the Polish trawler Rekin, call sign SQFA, transiting from Cold Bay to the Donut hole with its gear uncovered. The vessel was about 3 nautical miles from the Donut boundary when sighted. The case has been referred to NMFS.

d. <u>High Seas Driftnet violations:</u>

- (1) On June 01 a Kodiak based C-130 aircraft sighted three unidentified but probable Taiwanese driftnetters, drifting, in the vicinity of 42-00'N, 167-00'E, about 120 nautical miles north of the authorized squid driftnet fishing area. The USCGC BOUTWELL was diverted from patrol to investigate. C-130 flights on June 02 and 03 and the cutter were hampered by severe weather, and unsuccessful in relocating the vessels.
- (2) On June 02 a Kodiak based C-130 sighted one unidentified but probable Japanese driftnetter underway 20 nautical miles north of the authorized driftnet fishing area in approximate position 40-20'N, 174-14E. The vessel had the identifying number "7-817" on the pilot house.
- (3) On June 10 and 11 a Kodiak based C-130 aircraft sighted and relocated two unidentified, probable Taiwanese, driftnetters fishing in approximate position 41-58'N, 164-49'E. both vessels were observed retrieving nets. The sighting information was passed to the Soviet Maritime Border Guard by telex due to the vessels' proximity to the Soviet Union.

- (4) On June 16 a Kodiak based C-130 aircraft sighted four driftnetters and one support vessel between 16 and 47 nautical miles north of the authorized driftnet boundary. Three of the driftnetters were believed to be South Korean; HAE JIN NO. 6 (6NFH), HAN GIL NO. 105 (6KCY), AND CHUNG YANG NO. 3 (6NPH) and were sighted fishing in approximate position 40-40'N, 168-19W. The fourth driftnetter and cargo vessel, both believed to be Taiwanese, had call signs BH2025 and BEOQ respectively and were sighted fishing in approximate position 40-35N, 167-34'W.
- (5) On June 19, a Kodiak based C-130 aircraft sighted 18 driftnetters fishing 25 to 55 nautical miles north of the authorized driftnet boundary. All the vessels' had Taiwanese call signs, although several had them partially covered, and two had the Taiwanese flag visible on the pilothouse.
- (6) On June 26, a Kodiak based C-130 sighted 3 unidentified driftnetters in the vicinity of 45-39N, 166-40E, over 300 nautical miles north of the authorized driftnet area. One of the vessels' was photographed retrieving nets and the others were underway. In addition 15 other vessels were detected within 5 nautical miles but could not be identified due to fog.
- (7) On June 27, a Kodiak based C-130 aircraft sighted five driftnetters operating between 95 and 150 nautical miles north of the authorized driftnet boundary. Three of the vessels were fishing in the vicinity of 41-35N, 176-20E and had markings of Japanese vessels. The fourth vessel was sighted underway at 41-42N, 174-48E and believed to be Korean. The fifth vessel, sighted at 42-29N, 173-10E, was underway and had no identifying markings.
- (8) On June 29, a Kodiak based C-130 sighted four probable Taiwanese driftnetters fishing between 63 and 94 nautical miles north of the authorized driftnet boundary. The vessels call signs were BH281?, BH2289, BH2565, and BH2025.
- (9) On July 09, USCGC MUNRO sighted the South Korean driftnetter No 7 Kum DO (6MDO) approximately 29 nautical miles north of the authorized driftnet boundary. Upon sighting MUNRO, the vessel cut or abandoned its gear and immediately headed south toward the legal area. The vessel eventually stopped and was boarded. MUNRO's boarding team found no salmonids onboard, and even though the vessel had an ARGOS transponder registered to it, the transponder could not be found onboard.
- (10) On July 15, USCGC MUNRO sighted the Taiwanese driftnetter Cheng Sheng (BH2565) 57 nautical miles north of the authorized driftnet boundary. MUNRO's boarding team was within 100 yards of the vessel in the cutter's small boat when the Cheng Sheng got underway toward the legal area. The vessel ignored repeated orders to stop through the night of July 15 and continued to head south. The vessel eventually stopped after MUNRO contacted the Taiwanese enforcement vessel CHIA MING No. 1. A joint boarding by MUNRO and the Taiwanese enforcement vessel

discovered no salmonids onboard. MUNRO boarded five other vessels discovered north of the authorized boundary. They were the Taiwanese vessels; No. 66 Yu Cheng Far (BH2018), No. 11 Shin Using (BH2122), No. 36 CHang Fuh (BH3098), Jenn Chyun No. 6 (BH2681), and the South Korean vessel Dong K Youn No. 25 (6NQE). None of the vessels had salmonids onboard.

- (11) On July 15, a Kodiak based C-130 aircraft sighted 27 driftnetters (17 South Korean, 04 Taiwanese, and 06 unidentified) approximately 60 nautical miles north of the authorized driftnet area in the vicinity of 43-00'N, 174-00'W.
- On July 17, CGC MUNRO's embarked helicopter sighted the South Korean driftnetter Gal Mae Gi (6MNH) 39 nautical miles north of the authorized driftnet area. The vessel immediately headed south west when sighted. MUNRO intercepted the vessel while it was still north of the authorized area and ordered it to stop. The vessel continued heading south west until crossing into the legal driftnet area where it turned west and continued to ignore repeated calls by MUNRO to stop. also attempted to contact a Korean driftnet patrol vessel without response. MUNRO chased the Gal Mae Gi for over 32 hours before filly stopped after assistance through Coast Headquarters and the Department of State. The vessel was determined to be a Korean driftnet training vessel. No salmonids were found onboard.
- (13) On July 17, a Kodiak based C-130 sighted 10 driftnetters (02 South Korean and 08 Taiwanese) between 02 and 69 nautical miles north of the authorized driftnet area. 05 of the Taiwanese vessels and both Korean vessels were observed fishing.
- (14) On July 25, a Kodiak based C-130 sighted two probable Taiwanese driftnetters about 75 nautical miles north of the authorized driftnet boundary in approximate position 43-16'N, 171-28'W. One of the vessels, call sign BH2881, was observed pulling nets during the first pass of the aircraft. On the second pass the crew was observed covering the hull numbers with white sheets.
- (15) On August 21, a Kodiak based C-130 aircraft sighted four unidentified driftnetters fishing in approximate position 49-00'N, 166-00'E, 300 nautical miles north of the authorized driftnet boundary. The information was passed by telex to the Soviet Maritime Border Guard due to the vessels' proximity to the Soviet Union.

- e C-130 aircraft conducted 179 long-range surveillance flights for 1287.7 patrol hours.
- f. H-3 helicopters conducted 15 coastal surveillance flights for 78.7 patrol hours.



NATIONAL MARINE FISHERIES SERVICE ENFORCEMENT FOR THE PERIOD JUNE 1 THROUGH AUGUST 31, 1991

During the period June 1 through August 31, 1991, the NMFS, Office of Enforcement in Alaska expended 91 agent days in direct support of U.S. Coast Guard air and surface patrol efforts. Agents accompanied 39 aerial surveillance flights and accompanied surface units for 52 days. 68 dockside boardings were also conducted. The Alaska Region Enforcement staff has again been augmented by agents from other regions. These agents have primarily been assigned to high seas driftnet surveillance flights.

During the reporting period, NMFS and the Coast Guard opened a total of 301 investigations. NMFS independently initiated 184 cases. Total investigations initiated during 1991 now exceed 1,200 cases. This number is a near twofold increase over any preceding year. Staff case load for the Office of Enforcement and NOAA General Counsel are at an all time high. There is a large backlog of cases which is expected to grow.

A summary of NMFS initiated enforcement actions follows:

1. MFCMA Groundfish Violations:

- (a) During the reporting period NMFS initiated 50 investigations based on observer complaints. Complaints included observer harrassment, fishing in closed areas, fishing with illegal gear types, mishandling of prohibited species, and MARPOL violations. Eleven of the cases have been referred to other agencies for disposition. Seven cases were closed as unactionable. Investigations are continuing in 22 cases.
- (b) June 6, 1991 The longline vessel LADY NINA was cited for failure to maintain a groundfish logbook (9 days). The case will be referred to NOAA General Counsel for disposition.
- (c) June 13, 1991 The longline vessel NIGHTSHIFT was cited for failure to log discards of groundfish (5 counts). The vessel paid a \$3,750 summary settlement.
- (d) June 13, 1991 The longline vessel SHAMROCK was cited for failure to submit a groundfish log for the first quarter of 1991. The vessel paid a \$3,750 summary settlement.



- (e) June 18, 1991 The longline vessel EILEEN was cited for failure to update it's groundfish logbook within required time (1 count). The vessel paid a \$750 summary settlement.
- (f) June 18, 1991 The longline vessel GRIZZLY BEAR was cited for failure to update it's groundfish logbook within required time (1 count). The vessel paid a \$750 summary settlement.
- (g) June 18, 1991 The longline vessel BANSHEE II was cited for failure to submit a groundfish log for the first quarter of 1991. Disposition of the case is pending.
- (h) June 25, 1991 The longline vessel SEMIDI was cited for exceeding sablefish bycatch limitations. Groundfish valued at \$1,771 was seized. The case case will be referred to NOAA General Counsel for disposition.
- (i) July 10, 1991 The longline vessel SPECTRUM was cited for no halibut license and exceeding sablefish bycatch limitations. Case to be referred to NOAA General Counsel.
- (j) July 30, 1991 The trawl vessel FORUM STAR was cited for retention of prohibited species. 49 salmon and 1 halibut were seized. A \$4,950 summary settlement was offered.
- (k) August 8, 1991 The trawl vessel FORUM STAR was cited for retention of excess Pacific cod bycatch. Groundfish valued at \$6,342 was seized. Case to be referred to NOAA General Counsel.
- (1) August 21, 1991 The trawl vessel TOPAZ was cited for retention of excess Pacific cod and sablefish. Groundfish valued at \$2,718 was seized. Case to be referred to NOAA General Counsel.
- (m) August 21, 1991 The trawl vessel DONA MARTITA was cited for retention of prohibited species (3,071 lbs herring and 344 lbs. salmon). Case to be referred to NOAA General Counsel.
- (n) August 21, 1991 The longline vessel SANDRA FAY was cited for failure to obtain a 1990 federal groundfish permit and failure to maintain or submit a 1990 groundfish log. The vessel was offered a \$4,500 summary settlement.
- (o) August 21, 1991 The longline vessel NEVADA was cited for failure to obtain a 1990 federal groundfish permit and failure to maintain or submit a 1990 groundfish log. The vessel was offered a \$4,500 summary settlement.

- (p) August 21, 1991 The longline vessel FOOLS GOLD was cited for failure to obtain a 1990 federal groundfish permit and failure to maintain or submit a 1990 groundfish log. The vessel was offered a \$4,500 summary settlement.
- (q) August 22, 1991 The trawl vessel ONE OCEAN was cited for seven counts of retention of excess sablefish and Pacific cod bycatch. Groundfish valued at \$5,276 was seized. Case to be referred to NOAA General Counsel.

- (s) August 23, 1991 The longline vessel NOR QUEST was cited for failure to obtain a 1990 federal groundfish permit and failure to maintain or submit a 1990 groundfish log. The vessel was offered a \$4,500 summary settlement.
- (t) August 23, 1991 The longline vessel TERESA T was cited for failure to obtain a 1990 federal groundfish permit and failure to maintain or submit a 1990 groundfish log. The vessel was offered a \$4,500 summary settlement.
- (u) August 23, 1991 The pot vessel LAST FRONTIER was cited for failure to obtain a 1990 federal groundfish permit and failure to maintain or submit a 1990 groundfish log. The vessel was offered a \$4,500 summary settlement.
