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Report To The North Pacific Fishery Management Council Concerning U. S. Coast Guard MFCMA Enforcement

- 1. <u>U. S. Coast Guard enforcement effort</u>. U. S. Coast Guard enforcement effort for 1984 has totaled 144 cutter patrol days and 654 aircraft patrol hours for over 100,179 miles. Combined enforcement efforts have resulted in eighteen reports of violation and seventeen citations. Additional patrol effort analysis is included in the enclosures.
- 2. Recent MFCMA Infractions. Since the last council meeting Coast Guard enforcement effort has resulted in eighteen reports of violation (civil penalty procedures) and seventeen citations (written warnings) issued to foreign fishing vessels. The following summaries briefly describe the major infractions and enforcement activity.
- a. 20 January. CCGDSEVENTEEN (oil) issued a citation to the Japanese tanker vessel TENKAI MARU for failure to submit the required activity message twenty-four hours prior to ceasing fishing activity while checked in the Fishery Conservation Zone.
- In February, CCGDSEVENTEEN (oil) issued citations to the South Korean stern trawlers KYUNG YANG HO and SHINAN HO, and the Japanese medium stern trawler SOHO MARU No. 52, for failure to submit the required activity message twenty-four hours prior to activity while checked in the fishing Also in February, enforcement flights from Conservation Zone. Coast Guard Air Station Kodiak sighted numerous Soviet fishing vessels actively engaged in fishing east of the US-USSR Soviet vessels were also sighted Convention Line of 1867. fishing independently inside the U. S. Fishery Conservation Zone in the vicinity of the Convention Line. Documentation of all independent Soviet fishing activity sighted east of the Convention Line and those sightings actually inside the FCZ were forwarded to the U. S. Department of State for appropriate action.

- c. 29 February. USCGC STORIS issued a citation to the Japanese tanker vessel TENYOSHI MARU for failure to maintain the legibility and repair of its International Radio Call Sign (IRCS).
- d. 29 February. USCGC STORIS issued a citation to the South Korean cargo transport vessel No. 99 TAE BAEK for failure to transmit a required shift message while checked into the Fishery Conservation Zone.
- e. In March, CCGDSEVENTEEN (oil) issued citations to the following vessels for failure to submit the required activity message twenty-four hours prior to ceasing fishing activity while checked into the Fishery Conservation Zone:

- f. 10 March, USCGC YOCONA issued a report of violation to the Japanese longliner RYUSHO MARU NO. 15 for failure to provide a safe boarding ladder to the authorized boarding party.
- g. 17 March. USCGC JARVIS issued reports of violation to the U.S. fishing vessels ROYAL ATLANTIC and DONA GENOVEVA for fishing without valid federal groundfish permits for 1984. Both vessels were participating in the U.S. South Korean joint venture in the vicinity of Shelikof Strait.
- h. 19 March. USCGC JARVIS issued a citation to the Japanese large stern travler TSUDA MARU for failure to display the proper dayshape while at anchor.
- i. 20 March. USCGC JARVIS issued three reports of violation to the Japanese medium stern travler EIKYU MARU. Violations were issued for failure to submit the required activity messages on two occasions. A third violation was issued for failure to maintain the accuracy of its Daily Cumulative Catch Log (DCCL).
