SUBJECT: Joint Venture Update

ACTION REQUIRED

Information only.

BACKGROUND

Joint ventures have harvested 95,676 mt in the Bering Sea/Aleutians and 74,503 mt in the Gulf of Alaska through August 28. Gulf operations ended last April. Bering Sea operations are now limited to one or two companies. Summary tables of requests and catches to date are provided as item B-5(a) and (b). B-5(c) is a report from FPA. Additional information is given below.

Marine Resources Company's Soviet Joint Venture

The yellowfin sole fishery has one to two processors northwest of the Pribilofs, two to three processors in Bristol Bay, and about eight vessels are being used. This fishery began in April and should end by late September. The catch stands at 34,500 mt, 80% flatfish, 10-12% codfish and the rest other species. The goal is to catch 37,000 mt by late September.

The Marine Resources Atka mackerel fishery will end in late September. The projected catch through September 15 is 16,000-16,500 mt, 60% Atka mackerel.

2. Universal Seafoods/Nippon Suisan

Their second joint venture ended on August 23. Three U.S. trawlers, GOLDEN FLEECE, STARWARD, AND NEAHKAHNIE, have fished in this operation from Unimak Pass to the Pribilofs. The total catch was 11,400 mt, mostly pollock. Their first joint venture caught 9,908 mt.

3. Westward Trawlers/Taiyo Fishery Company

Their third operation will commence on September 25 with a goal of 10,000 mt mainly pollock from the Bering Sea. One processor and four to five U.S. trawlers will be used. Westward's earlier operations caught about 17,000 mt by early June.

Swiftsure/Chong Shing Ocean Enterprise

Operations have not commenced yet for lack of a vessel permit which is still in processing in Washington, D.C.

Dear Mr. Pautzke:

As an up date of our phone conversation of August 4, 1982, I would like to confirm that our 1982 joint venture operation concluded amicably on April 25, 1982 with a total of 32,023 metric tons delivered to Korea Wonyang Fisheries processors and that KWF has paid all outstanding invoices in full for fish delivered this year.

As we are again anticipating a joint venture fishery of at least the same tonnage as last year, the increase of the OY to 143,000 metric tons in the Shelikof area that the Council is recommending will hopefully offer our joint venture enough allocation security and latitude to co-exist with other joint ventures in that area. As you are aware, we have been successful fishing that zone for the past two years and would like to continue in the future.

We will keep you informed on any further details as plans unfold for next year.
