The 1988 Amendments to the Marine Mammal Protection Act created and new Section 114, which included guidelines for a 5-year interim exemption program for commercial fisheries. The NMFS has begun to develop guidelines for a permanent regime to govern the taking of marine mammals by commercial fisheries. The Secretary of Commerce will present the final recommendations to Congress in January 1991.

As part of the development process, the NMFS will prepare a Draft Environmental Impact Statement (DEIS). The DEIS will present alternative regimes and discuss the environmental impacts of each. The initial agency action for this program is to hold scoping meetings in various parts of the nation. The first scoping meeting will be in Silver Spring on May 31. The Northwest Region tentatively set June 12 as a date for a meeting in Seattle. The Alaska Region wishes to hold a scoping meeting in conjunction with the June Council meeting. This should be preceded by a brief presentation to the Council to explain the process and how it affects commercial fisheries in Alaska. Steve Davis have tentatively "penciled in" a presentation to the Council on the schedule for Monday, June 25, to be followed by a scoping meeting at 7:00 that evening.
