1. U. S. COAST GUARD ENFORCEMENT EFFORT FOR 1986.

a. MFCMA ACTIONS. U. S. Coast Guard enforcement efforts for calendar year 1986, through 17 June, have totalled 183 cutter days and 688 aircraft patrol hours. These patrol efforts have covered more than 7.4 million square miles of ocean and resulted in the issuance of 54 reports of violation and 26 written warnings to foreign fishing vessels and 10 reports of violation and 2 written warnings to U.S. fishing vessels. Additional patrol information is provided in the enclosures.

b. JAPANESE HIGH SEAS SALMON OPERATIONS.

- 1) The Japanese land based high seas salmon fleet commenced its operations in the North Pacific Ocean, south of the Aleutian Islands, approximately 1 June 1986.
- 2) The first Coast Guard C-130 surveillance flight was flown on 30 May with no sightings of fishing vessels made near the eastern abstention line. Routine Coast Guard surveillance flights started 5 June. The Coast Guard Cutter MORGENTHAU commenced its surface patrol on 4 June. A meeting was conducted with Japanese enforcement officials aboard the patrol vessel TOKO MARU to discuss enforcement matters.
- 3) To date a total of seven C-130 flights have been flown and 14 cutter days steamed in support of this fishery.
- 4) While patrol units have made numerous sightings of Japanese land based gillnet vessels west of the 174E boundary, thus far only one has been sighted east of that line. That vessel was sighted underway in position 40-17N, 175-34E. Photos were obtained and have been forwarded to Coast Guard Headquarters for further evaluation and dissemination to the State Department.
- 2. MFCMA INFRACTIONS. The following summarizes specific major infractions and enforcement activity since the Coast Guard's last report to the Council.
- a. In March, CCGDSEVENTEEN JUNEAU (oil) issued written warnings to the following fishing vessels for failure to submit the required activity message twenty-four hours prior to beginning/ceasing fishing operations within the U. S. Fishery Conservation Zone (FCZ): BEREG NADEZDY, MABAH, SHINKO MARU, and DAE JIN NO. 21.

- b. 11 March 1986. USCGC SHERMAN issued a report of violation to the South Korean trawler JOON SUNG HO for failure to properly maintain their Daily Catch Log.
 - c. 11 March .1986. USCGC SHERMAN issued three reports of violation to the South Korean trawler NO. 70 OYANG HO for the following infractions:
 1) failure to submit the proper vessel reporting message when shifting to a new statistical area; 2) failure to log prohibited species in its Daily Catch Log; and 3) failure to allow embarked NMFS observer to sample prohibited species.
 - d. 11 March 1986. USCGC SHERMAN issued two reports of violation to the U.S. fishing vessel ARCTIC TRAWLER for failure to provide a safe boarding ladder and for failure to submit catch and activity reports as required.
 - e. 11 March 1986. USCGC SHERMAN issued a report of violation to the U.S. fishing vessel NORTHERN GLACIER for failure to submit catch and activity reports as required.
 - f. 13 March 1986. USCGC SHERMAN issued one report of violation and one written warning to the U.S. fishing vessel OCEAN BOUNTY. The written warning was issued for failure to provide a safe boarding ladder, and the report of violation was issued for failure to return prohibited species (halibut) in a timely manner.
- g. 13 March 1986. USCGC SHERMAN issued three reports of violation to the U.S. trawler ALEUTIAN TRAWLER for: 1) failure to facilitate the boarding; 2) failure to return prohibited species (halibut) in a timely manner; and 3) failure to submit catch and activity reports as required.
 - h. 21 March 1986. USCGC RUSH issued a written warning to the Japanese long liner HATSUE MARU NO. 38 for failure to provide an acceptable boarding ladder.
 - i. 24 March 1986. USCGC RUSH issued three reports of violation to the Chinese (PRC) trawler KAI CHUNG for failure to properly submit a "begin" message; and for two counts of failure to properly maintain its Daily Joint Venture Log.
 - j. 26 March 1986. USCGC RUSH issued two written warnings to the Soviet trawler SVETLAYA for failure to provide an acceptable boarding ladder and failure to hold accurate vessel plans on board.
 - k. 26 March 1986. USCGC RUSH issued a report of violation to the Soviet trawler USSURIISKAIA TAIGA for failure to submit the proper activity report on three separate occasions.
 - 1. 28 March 1986. USCGC RUSH issued a report of violation to the U.S. fishing vessel LADY OF GOOD VOYAGE for failure to hold a federal groundfish permit on board.

- m. 1 April 1986. CCGDSEVENTEEN JUNEAU (oil) issued a written warning to the Japanese transport vessel RYOYO MARU for failure to submit the appropriate activity message twenty-four hours prior to commencing fishing operations within the U.S. FCZ.
- n. 8 April 1986. USCGC RUSH issued five reports of violation to the Chinese (PRC) trawler GENG HAI for the following infractions: failure to log product recovery rates (PRR's) daily; and four counts of failure to properly maintain its Daily Joint Venture Log.
- o. 10 April 1986. USCGC RUSH issued a report of violation to the Japanese stern trawler KONGO MARU for failure to submit required weekly Marine Mammal Report on one occasion.
- p. 11 April 1986. USCGC JARVIS issued a report of violation to the South Korean stern trawler NO. 70 OYANG HO for interfering with and biasing the embarked NMFS observer's species sampling.
- q. 11 April 1986. USCGC JARVIS issued a report of violation to the Soviet trawler TRETJAKOVO for failure to maintain a continuous listening quard on channel 16 VHF/FM.
- r. 12 April 1986. USCGC JARVIS issued a report of violation and two written warnings to the Japanese trawler SHINEI MARU NO. 63. The written warnings were issued for failure to properly maintain its Daily Catch Log and failure to provide a safe boarding ladder. The report of violation was issued for failure to accurately log the vessel's catch of prohibited species.
- s. 13 April 1986. USCGC JARVIS issued one report of violation and one written warning to the Soviet trawler MYS LAZAREVA for failure to monitor channel 16 VHF/FM and failure to provide an acceptable boarding ladder.
- t. 16 April 1986. USCGC JARVIS issued a written warning to the Japanese trawler KASHIMA MARU NO. 8 for failure to properly maintain its Daily Catch Log.
- u. 18 April 1986. USCGC JARVIS issued a written warning to the Japanese transport vessel KIYO MARU for failure to maintain a continuous listening guard on channel 16 VHF/FM.
- v. 20 April 1986. USCGC JARVIS issued a report of violation to the Japanese long liner RYUSHO MARU NO. 18 for failure to report lost gear as required.
- w. 21 April 1986. USCGC JARVIS issued two reports of violation to the Japanese transport vessel KIYO MARU for failure to maintain a continuous listening guard on channel 16 VHF/FM and failure to maintain on board all required records and logs.
- x. 22 April 1986. USCGC JARVIS issued a report of violation to the Polish trawler SAGITTA for failure to properly maintain its Daily Joint Venture Log.

- y. 22 April 1986. USCGC JARVIS issued a written warning to the U.S. trawler PACIFIC VIKING for failure to have a federal groundfish permit on board.
- z. 23 April 1986. USCGC JARVIS issued a report of violation to the U.S. trawler ALYESKA for failure to provide a boarding ladder.
- aa. 23 April 1986. USCGC JARVIS issued a report of violation to the U.S. trawler ANDREW MCGEE for failure to provide a boarding ladder.
- ab. 23 April 1986. USCGC JARVIS issued a written warning to the Soviet trawler MYS ELAGINA for making improper corrections to its Daily Joint Venture Log.
- ac. 23 April 1986. USCGC JARVIS issued to the Soviet trawler MYS EGOROVA, a report of violation for failure to accurately report its activities, and two written warnings for failure to properly maintain the Daily Joint Venture Log.
- ad. 25 April 1986. USCGC JARVIS issued a report of violation and a written warning to the Soviet factory vessel DALNIY VOSTOK for failure to send an accurate "begin" message and failure to accurately maintain its Daily Joint Venture Log.
- ae. 25 April 1986. USCGC JARVIS issued two reports of violation to the Soviet trawler POGRANICHNIK STRELNIKOV for failure to accurately maintain its Daily Joint Venture Log and failure to stow non-fish products atop or separately from fish products.
 - af. 26 April 1986. USCGC JARVIS issued a report of violation to the Japanese pot (snail) vessel EIWA MARU NO. 38 for failure to provide a safe boarding ladder.
 - ag. 27 April 1986. USCGC JARVIS issued four reports of violation to the Chinese (PRC) trawler KAI CHUNG for: 1) failure to accurately maintain its Daily Catch Log; 2) failure to maintain proper product stowage; 3) failure to return prohibited species immediately with minimal damage; and 4) retaining prohibited species on board.
 - ah. 4 May 1986. CCGDSEVENTEEN JUNEAU (oil) issued a written warning to the South Korean factory vessel NO. 99 TAE BAEK for failure to submit the appropriate activity message twenty-four hours prior to beginning fishing operations within the U.S. FCZ.
 - ai. 12 May 1986. USCGC JARVIS issued a report of violation and a written warning to the Chinese (PRC) trawler GENG HAI for failure to properly maintain its Daily Joint Venture Log and its Transfer Log.
 - aj. 12 May 1986. USCGC JARVIS issued two reports of violation to the Chinese (PRC) trawler YAN YUAN NO. 1 for failure to properly maintain its Transfer Log and failure to accurately maintain its Daily Joint Venture Log.

- ak. 15 May 1986. USCGC JARVIS issued two reports of violation to the Soviet trawler TRUSKAVETS for two counts of failure to maintain its Daily Joint Venture Log.
- al. 16 May 1986. USCGC JARVIS issued a report of violation to the South Korean trawler SALVIA for failure to accurately maintain its Daily Joint Venture Log.
- am. 16 May 1986. USCGC JARVIS issued a report of violation to the Soviet trawler BAGNOVA for failure to return prohibited species immediately with minimal damage.
- an. 16 May 1986. USCGC JARVIS issued a report of violation to the Japanese trawler AKEBONO MARU NO. 27 for failure to accurately maintain its Daily Catch Log.
- ao. 18 May 1986. USCGC JARVIS issued a report of violation to the Japanese trawler SHUNYO MARU NO. 118 for failure to have its International Radio Call Sign (IRCS) clearly displayed on a weather deck.
- ap. 19 May 1986. USCGC JARVIS issued a report of violation to the South Korean trawler NO. 71 DONG BANG for failure to accurately maintain its Daily Joint Venture Log.
- aq. 20 May 1986. USCGC JARVIS issued a written warning to the Japanese long liner EBISU MARU NO. 88 for failure to accurately maintain its Transfer Log.
- ar. 21 May 1986. USCGC JARVIS issued three reports of violation to the South Korean trawler HAN JIN HO for: 1) failure to maintain continuous listening guard on channel 16 VHF/FM; 2) failure to accurately maintain its Daily Joint Venture Log; and 3) failure to accurately maintain its Transfer Log.
- as. 21 May 1986. USCGC JARVIS issued a written warning to the South Korean trawler SHIN YANG HO for failure to accurately maintain its Daily Joint Venture Log.
