I. High Seas Drift Net (HSDN) Enforcement

There was no HSDN enforcement activity conducted over the reporting period.

II. U.S./Russian Maritime Boundary Line (MBL) Enforcement

Activity along the MBL was moderate over the reporting period with an average of 11 fishing vessels operating within 20 miles of the MBL during October 2014. USCGC MUNRO conducted a patrol of the MBL on 01-03 October, during which time they sighted seven foreign fishing vessels, all on the Russian side of the MBL. Coast Guard aircraft also conducted a patrol of the MBL on 10 October 2013, sighting 12 foreign fishing vessels, all on the Russian side of the MBL.


III. Steller Sea Lions (SSL) and Critical Habitat Enforcement

The Coast Guard monitors more than 151 critical habitat areas around the state each month as part of routine cutter and aircraft patrol activity. No violations of SSL critical habitat were detected during the reporting period.

IV. Fishing Vessel Boarding Statistics


Figure 1. Fisheries Boardings By Year

There were 76 domestic fisheries and fishing vessel safety boardings conducted by the U.S. Coast Guard during the reporting period. These boardings resulted in a total of 25 safety violations onboard 15 vessels and three federal fisheries violations onboard three vessels. Figures 1 and 2 show the historic trends for boardings and violations.

V. Halibut and Sablefish Enforcement

The IFQ halibut and sablefish fisheries closed at 1200 local time on 07 November. There were eleven boardings of vessels targeting halibut over the reporting period. Four vessels were fishing for sablefish in the state commercial fishery. There were no fisheries violations during any of the IFQ halibut or sablefish boardings.

There were seven boardings of vessels fishing recreational or subsistence halibut during the reporting period. There was one fisheries violation on one vessel for subsistence fishing for halibut in a closed area, as well as three safety violations. In addition, one boarding of a charter halibut vessel was completed with no fisheries violations.

VI. Crab Fisheries


The Coast Guard focused commercial vessel safety enforcement activities on the start of the Bering Sea crab fisheries, with CGC MUNRO conducting 14 boardings on vessels targeting Bristol Bay Red King Crab and five boardings on vessels targeting Eastern Bering Sea Tanner Crab. There were no violations found during these boardings although seven vessels had not yet received safety and stability compliance checks. Pre-season safety and stability compliance checks were conducted in Kodiak and Dutch Harbor, and a Coast Guard helicopter was forward deployed to Cold Bay for search and rescue standby.

VI. Commercial Fishing Vessel Safety/Search and Rescue Cases

During the reporting period, 25 safety violations were detected on 15 vessels. There were two voyage terminations during the reporting period. A comprehensive list of violations can be found in Appendix C.

There were 19 SAR cases involving fishing vessels, resulting in five lives saved, and no lives lost. Appendix A provides a comprehensive list of search and rescue cases involving fishing vessels over the reporting period.

Figure 4. Annual HC-130 Hours





Figure 5. Annual Major Cutter Days

Figure 6. Oct – Nov HC-130 Hours





Figure 7. Oct – Nov Major Cutter Days
