IT'S OK

ENJOY BOTTOMFISH.

During the 2008 Seasonal Closure, there are new regulations that prohibit fishing for seven deepwater species of bottomfish (listed on back) in the main Hawaiian Islands. However, these fish may still be available to you. It's still okay to enjoy these fish if they have been caught legally in the permitted Northwestern Hawaiian Islands bottomfish fishery or were imported from overseas.
