AYK Summary

- All AYK Chinook stocks at all-time lows in 2013
- Unalakleet and Yukon runs in 2013 not large enough to meet escapement needs, even if no fish were to be taken in the river
- Kuskokwim area runs in 2013 large enough to meet escapement needs, but not large enough for subsistence needs
- 2014 is expected to be equally poor with unprecedented management restrictions:
 - No commercial harvest of Chinook
 - Most severe restrictions to date on other salmon commercial fisheries to reduce incidental catch to the greatest extent possible
 - · No sport fishing
 - Most severe subsistence restrictions to date

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
