





Dear Rick,

We would like to nominate Tom Casey, our executive director, to serve as a Washington State representative on PNCIAC for several reasons.

First, Tom was deeply involved in the original writing of the Magnuson Fisheries Conservation and Management Act of 1976. During 1975 and 1976, he represented the interests of many Alaska crab fishermen before key Senators and Representatives in Congress during the mark-ups and final passage of the 200-mile limit bill.

Second, for years Tom was the chief crab price negotiator for the Kodiak crab fleet. His job was to understand prevailing market conditions as well as our buyers did and to win us the best ex-vessel price possible each season for king crab and Bairdi tanner crab. This he did for us consistently.

Third, Tom has fished on halibut schooners, salmon seiners and crab boats in Kodiak, South Peninsula and Bering Sea. He knows first-hand what working conditions are like in the Alaska crab fisheries. That's one of his highest values to us.

Fourth, we've kept Tom involved in the Alaska Board of Fisheries' crab management process for over 20-years now. He knows the system as well as anyone does and he knows full-well that conservation of the brood stock is our top priority and our only means of achieving long-term success in the Bering Sea crab business.

So we want to recommend Tom to the Council as a man who's come up in this business through the hawse pipe, served his time on crabbers, halibut schooners

and salmon seiners and become a competitive negotiator and advocate of our interests in the crab fisheries of the Alaskan 200-mile zone.

We hope you will appoint him to a Washington State voting membership on PNCIAC at your December meeting. Our members, who currently own Bering Sea crab vessels worth \$40-\$50 million, thank you.
