SUBJECT: Foreign Vessel Permit Applications

ACTION REQUIRED

Approve foreign permits for 1986.

BACKGROUND

The Council has received 542 permit applications from six countries as follows:

Under the Council's current review policy, the Executive Director may approve permit applications that do not involve (1) serious violators, (2) joint ventures, (3) new countries or (4) unusual operations. Vessel applications falling in these four categories are discussed below.

<u>Serious Violators</u>. Item C-7(a) lists 36 foreign vessels which are defined as serious violators by the Council's permit review policy because they have:

- (1) A final civil penalty or assessed civil penalty of \$10,000 or more in 1985;
- (2) two or more civil penalties paid or assessed totaling \$10,000 or more in 1984-85; and/or
- (3) been seized in the past five permit years.

Of the serious violators, the following request to work with joint ventures in 1986:

- Any case with a civil penalty of \$10,000 or more paid or assessed during the previous permit year (since 1/1/85).
- Any vessel that has two or more cases with civil penalties totalling \$10,000 or more paid or assessed during the two previous permit years (since 1/1/84). No cases fall into this category this year.
- All seizures in the past five permit years (since 1/1/81). Repeat seizures by these vessels have also been listed.

Violation: Forcible assault of an observer.

Settlement in the amount of \$20,000 is in progress.

Settled in January 1983 for \$400,000 and an 8-month permit sanction.

Seized April 1981.

Violation: Mislogging catch. Total catch was underlogged by 30 percent, with pollock and Pacific cod overlogged to mask an underlogging of turbot and flounder.

Settled May 1981 with a penalty of \$550,000 and a 6-month permit sanction.

Seized April 1981.

Violation: Mislogging catch. Turbot, sablefish, and Pacific ocean perch were underlogged, while several other species, including flounder, Pacific cod, and pollock, were overlogged.

Settled November 1981 for \$400,000 and a 5-month permit sanction.

Seized February 1979.

Violation: Underlogging catch of Pacific herring.

Settled April 1979 for \$225,000.

Seized August 1981.

Violation: Mislogging during each of four trips into the FCZ during 1981; vessel overlogged pollock, other species, and flounder, while underlogging squid, Pacific cod, sablefish, turbot, Pacific ocean perch, and yellowfin sole.

Settled July 1982 for \$700,000 and 18-month permit sanction.

Seized February 1980.

Violation: Underlogging catch by 20 percent. Settled on May 1980 for \$40,000.

Seized October 1985.

Violation: Retention of prohibited species (halibut/sablefish). Settlement for \$85,000 in progress.

Seized October 1982.

Violation: Species manipulation; underlogging cod and sablefish by 53 and 96 percent respectively.

Settled September 1983 for \$307,000 and 8-month permit sanction.

Seized September 1977.

Violation: Retention of prohibited species flounder, sebastes, squid, and Pacific cod (species for which Taiwan had no quota).

Violation: Underlogged pollock catch by 53 percent. Settled October 1979 for \$250,000.

Seized December 1982.

Violation: Fishing in a closed area, retention of prohibited species, and mislogging.

Seized August 1979.

Violation: Underlogged pollock catch by 48 percent.

Settled October 1979 for \$250,000.

Settled April 1984 for \$500,000 and 3-year permit sanction (12/20/82-12/19/85).

HIYO MARU (JA-85-2025, JRBU)

Seized March 1983.

Violation: Underlogging/mislogging of cargo transfer log (sablefish). Settled April 1983 for \$200,000.

KIYO MARU NO. 55 (JA-85-0602, JKRL)

AK830258

Seized October 1983.

Violation: Mislogging catch; underlogged sablefish and other species, while overlogging Pacific cod and turbot.

Settled December 1984 for \$200,000.

KORYO MARU NO. 23 (JA-85-0423, JRCI)

AK790110/AK820107

Seized October 1979 as the EBISU MARU NO. 38. Violation: Underlogging total catch by 26 percent. Settled October 1980 for \$300,000 and 2-month permit sanction.

Seized August 1982 as KORYO MARU NO. 23 (different ownership).

Violation: Mislogging catch, which resulted in a 43 percent underlog.

Vessel underlogged Pacific cod, turbot, and rockfish, while overlogging pollock, flounder, and other species.

Settled November 1982 for \$400,000 and 8-month permit sanction.

NIKKO MARU (JA-83-1077, JGAL)

AK830283

Seized November 1983.

Violation: Twenty catcher vessels owned or controlled by Nichiro Gyogyo Kaisha, Ltd. underlogged fish caught and transferred to cargo vessel NIKKO MARU in 1982 and 1983. Documents indicated underlogging by almost 50 percent.

Settled in January 1985 for \$2,000,000 and permit sanctions totalling 20 vessel-years against the NIKKO MARU and catcher vessels.
