B-1 Executive Director's Report

The Executive Director's report was presented by Clarence Pautzke. The Advisory Panel had no additional comments to the report.

C-3 Foreign Directed Fishing and Joint Venture Policies

Industry Workgroup Report and Review of Policy. Mick Stevens gave a report on the domestic joint venture participants' draft "Council Policy on Joint Ventures."

The Advisory Panel would like to thank Mick Stevens for preparing this proposed draft for setting criteria for prioritizing future joint venture activities as they relate to bringing the U.S. shoreside and harvesting industries into total utilization of our resources.

The AP recommends that the Council not adopt any such policy at this meeting as there were many suggestions on the draft presented to us. The AP suggests to the Council that the draft be sent out to the public for comment so a decision for internal policy review by the Council on future joint ventures can be adopted, possibly in September.

Some of the comments from the AP were as follows:

(1) Following categories A,B,C, and D, there should be an example so future permit review committees could have a standard to refer to when reviewing joint ventures.

- (2) The Council needs to set a policy on vessels and companies with constant enforcement problems.
- (3) The comments on prohibited species and potential by-catch of other than prohibited species should be reworded.

There were additional comments from the harvesting and shorebased processing sectors of the AP that will need additional thought between now and September. Generally, the policy tries to delineate the concept that the more Americanized the operation the better, which is a needed policy.

C-4 Foreign Fishing Permit Applications

Polish Joint Venture. Lacking any permit or formal presentation, the AP was unable to comment on any Polish request.

The AP would like to express that any arrangement with the Polish should have a healthy required purchase of U.S. industry product before any directed fishing is allowed.

There was some expressed opposition due to the problem of the Japanese lack of purchases of processed product and before additional arrangements are made with other countries arrangements with existing nations should be fulfilled.

C-5 Follow up on April Policy Meeting

With respect to the procedures suggested by the Council at their April meeting the AP suggests a year's operations under the proposed rules to see how they work before suggesting any changes.

With respect to the Plan Team make-up, the SSC should approve the participants for their individual expertise. There did not seem to be a great need for alternates on the Plan Team, but those participants should likewise be screened by the SSC for their participation.

 $\overline{\text{SSC}}$. The AP at the April meeting as well as at this meeting expressed that the requirement for alternates was not a great need. The SSC should be made up of the best scientific talent available representing an objective viewpoint. The Council should try to avoid a SSC make-up that only expresses agency opinion with the use of alternates to maintain those positions. There was some suggestion that if the Council wanted alternates for the SSC or Plan Team it would be appropriate to also provide alternates for Advisory Panel participants.

 - (1) The Council should request the Board to reconsider the bait-up requirement in the St. Matthew fishery due to safety reasons.
 - (2) The next joint Council/Board meeting should provide time for the Council to get through the entire decision making process with the Board of Fisheries regarding crab decisions pertaining to the shared authority of the Council and Board of Fisheries.
 - (3) The closure around St. Laurence and the Diamedes extending beyond three miles was voted on without scientific data being presented to the industry. The Council should requiest and have a response by September from the Board of Fisheries as to their documentation supporting that closure.
- (b) Review of Permit Provisions in FMP. The Advisory Panel unanimously recommends that the Council pursue a federal permit requirement in the implementing regulations.

D-3 Tanner Crab FMP

The Advisory Panel unanimously approved a motion to recommend that the Council direct the Regional Director to withhold or withdraw that portion of the Tanner crab regulatory amendment which would eliminate the old federal pot storage area for the Bristol Bay area. This action would bring the FMP into compliance with the state on pot storage issues.

The AP again expresses satisfaction with the success of the joint Council/Board meeting.
