

# DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION UNITED STATES COAST GUARD

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### REPORT TO THE NORTH PACIFIC FISHERIES MANAGEMENT COUNCIL CONCERNING COAST GUARD FCMA ENFORCEMENT

- 1. <u>Recent FCMA Infractions</u>. Since the last Council meeting, one report of violation (civil penalty procedure) and six citations (written warnings) have been issued. A brief summary of each infraction is as follows:
- A. 24 July The Japanese trawler OHTORI MARU was issued a citation by USCGC MUNRO for failure to properly maintain cumulative catch log.
- B. 24 July The Japanese trawler TENYO MARU NO. 5 was issued a citation by USCGC MUNRO for failure to return prohibited species to the sea in a timely manner.
- C. 26 July The Japanese trawler ZUIYO MARÚ NO. 3 was issued a report of violation by USCGC MUNRO for failure to return prohibited species to the sea in a timely manner.
- D. 28 July The Japanese snail vessel HOYO MARU NO. 63 was issued a citation by USCGC MELLON for failure to provide a safe boarding ladder and for failure to have correct IRCS on side.
- E. 14 August The Japanese longliner RYUSHO MARU NO.15 was issued a citiation by USCGC RESOLUTE for failure to bring forward cumulative catch total from previous trip this year.
- F. 16 August The Japanese longliner HATSUE MARU NO. 38 was issued a citation by USCGC RESOLUTE for failure to bring forward cumulative catch total from previous trip this year.
- G. 20 August The South Korean longliner NO.31 DONG WON was issued a citation by the USCGC MORGENTHAU for commencing fishing in an area 40 hours before submitting proper area shift message.
