SUBJECT: Coastwide Data Element Review

The Pacific Marine Fisheries Commission presently is evaluating information requirements for regional fisheries management along the Pacific Coast, the availability of such information, and alternatives for improving its flow from collector to user. This effort is supported by a contract between PMFC and NMFS for the period September 1, 1978 to August 31, 1979.

To establish a current baseline of fisheries management information requirements, their priority and frequency of reporting, we have sent questionnaires to members of management committees and teams for various fisheries along the Pacific Coast. Though fisheries under the purview of the Pacific Council have been emphasized, several important fisheries of mutual concern to both the Pacific and North Pacific Councils also have been included.

The questionnaire and distribution list are enclosed (Enclosures 1 and 2) for your information. However, we certainly would welcome your responses and any suggestions on additional people to survey.

Coastwide Data Element Review

The Pacific Marine Fisheries Commission presently is evaluating information requirements for regional fisheries management along the Pacific Coast, the availability of such information, and alternatives for improving its flow from collector to user. This effort is supported by a contract between PMFC and NMFS for the period 1 September 1978 to 31 August 1979.

A Regional Committee for Fisheries Data Consolidation was convened on 31 July 1978. This Committee is composed of representatives of State and Federal fisheries agencies and the two Fishery Management Councils on the Pacific Coast. This Committee succeeds the Coastwide Data Task Force. At the July meeting, the concern was expressed that in establishing a regional information network (this does not imply a large central computer), the information required by fisheries managers, biologists, and economists should be adequately identified. In reviewing the progress of the Coastwide Data Task Force through 1976, it was found that several surveys were conducted of biologists and economists to compile information elements prioritized by degree of desirability and need for management.

Many of you already may have devoted your time and effort to those previous surveys. Again we are asking for your consideration. It has been more than two years since the last query, and now, with the Regional Councils established, information requirements and their priorities may have changed. Therefore, we are sending this questionnaire to establish a current baseline. We are well aware that heavy commitments in time and energy already have been placed on you as a direct result of the fishery Conservation and Management Act of 1976. However, we greatly desire and need your expertise and guidance in establishing a baseline of required fishery management information.

To facilitate your answering, we have provided a list of data elements compiled in the last survey together with their priorities, by fishery, as assigned by biologists and economists. Several new elements have been added and are so designated. Blank lines are provided for any additional elements you deem necessary. Originally, priorities 1, 2 and 3 meant Highest, Somewhat less, and Desirable. Under the column Rev., please assign a revised priority using the new codes: 1 is Mandatory - essential to management of fishery; 2 is Critical - highly desirable; 3 is Desirable - would facilitate management; and 4 - Not Required. Also,

please indicate the frequency (Freq.) for transmitting the information to you, using the codes: D - daily; W - weekly; B - bi-weekly; M - monthly; and S - seasonally. These priorities and frequencies should be indicated for the fishery or fisheries of your expertise (if you feel that there are ambiguities in any information element, please add an explanatory note). Finally, please add your name at the top of the questionnaire.

We would appreciate very much your returning the completed questionnaire to PMFC by 6 October if at all possible. The reason for the haste is a meeting of the Regional Committee on 16 and 17 October prior to PMFC's Annual Meeting on 17 to 19 October in Coeur d'Alene. Your quick response will allow us to compile the results of this Survey for presentation at the Committee meeting. Then the Committee will be able to determine the availability and form of your desired information.
