SUBJECT: A Bill (HR 5611) To Amend the FCMA

### ACTION REQUIRED

Comment is requested.

### BACKGROUND

Congressman Don Young of Alaska has introduced HR 5611 to amend the Fishery Conservation and Management Act of 1976 to provide for the expedited review of fishery management plans and to change the composition of the Pacific Council. The Bill proposes several basic changes to the Act:

It would add Alaska to the Pacific Fishery Management Council as a voting member and change the voting membership from 13 to 15; it would change the Secretarial appointments from 8 to 10 on the Pacific Council and require at least two of these appointments to be from each state provided that only one member shall be appointed from Alaska; and

it proposes a "sundown clause" on the Secretary of Commerce review of a fishery management plan or amendment.

The Bill proposes that within 45 days the Secretary must approve such plan or amendment or disapprove such plan or amendment and if no action is taken within 60 days, the plan or amendment will automatically take effect as though approved.

An editorial mistake in the Bill would have given the Pacific Council authority over Alaska, but I've been assured the mistake will be corrected.
