suвject: Shrimp Workshop Status Report

This material will bring you up to date on the shrimp workshop scheduled to be held February 13, 14, and 15 in Kodiak.

Enclosed are:

- (1) Final Topic Agenda (Panel members and speakers yet to be selected).
- (2) Sample Questionnaire.
- (3) Mailing list of potential attendees (with notes and responses to date).
- (4) List of persons receiving informational copies.
- (5) A tentative schedule of events.

The local Elk's Club banquet room has been reserved and a block of 20 rooms has been tentatively reserved at the Sheffield House (Kodiak Inn). I will meet with the manager of the K.I. later in the month to add or reduce the number of rooms.

On November 30, mailgrams were sent to all potential U.S. participants and night letters were sent to potential foreign participants who had not previously responded to our original mailing (October 27). Included in the message were the final dates and a request that we be advised of their desire to attend.

On December 1, final copies of the topic agenda were mailed. To date we have nine respondents. By mid-December, I will initiate follow-up phone calls to non-respondents in the U.S. and will send a cable to potential foreign participants. The following week, a list of both paid and unpaid participants should be compiled and formal invitations will be sent by telegram to provide the maximum lead time possible to participants. Simultaneous to the invitations a brief questionnaire concerning housing requirements will be sent. Specific assignments for panel participation and presentation of papers will also be made at this time.

Formal invitations will be sent out to all participants who have their own funding. as we are notified of their interest to attend. January 15 is the date projected as the cutoff date for submission of papers. Due to the brief time period allotted it may not be realistic to request a paper by this date. It would be more realistic to either delay submission or publish the papers or their abstracts with the proceedings of the workshop. I've talked with Hank Pennington, Sea Grant Advisory Agent, and he plans to phone Don Rosenberg to discuss the mechanics of recording the meeting. I feel it would be best to tape all of the sessions and either transcribe the entire meeting and then have it edited, or abstract the highlights of each session particularly summarizing comments of each panel and the entire panel "Is there a need for management?"

During the middle of December I will attempt to set up a meeting with Jim Majors, East Point Seafoods, Chuck Jensen, Pacific Pearl Seafoods and the Alaska Shrimp Trawlers Assn., to discuss the status of the workshop.
