FOR MARCH COUNCIL/BOARD MEETING

PLEASE TAKE SPECIAL NOTICE that the dates and location of the March meeting of the North Pacific Fishery Management Council have been changed. The Council will meet jointly with the Alaska Board of Fisheries in the Alaska Room of the Westward Hilton, Third and E Streets, Anchorage, beginning at 9 a.m. on Tuesday, March 23, 1982, and continuing through Thursday, March 25. The meeting will be devoted primarily to final action on proposed 1982 amendments to the Southeast Alaska Troll Salmon Fishery Management Plan and joint management with the Alaska Board of Fisheries of the king crab fishery. A public hearing on proposed amendments to the Troll Salmon FMP will be held by both groups on Tuesday, March 23, in the Alaska Room after staff reports on the resource.

The Advisory Panel will meet from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. on Monday, March 22, 1982, in the Trattoria at the Westward Hilton.

The Scientific and Statistical Committee will convene at 9:30 a.m. on Monday, March 22 and continue on Tuesday, March 23, in the Council's headquarters conference room.
