

UPDATE ON STAFF PAPER: COUNCIL PROCESS AND IDEAS FOR CHANGE

- In April, Council prioritized 5 ideas:
 - Changes to the AP/SSC nomination process

 - Council may continue to rely on SSC to help with recruitment
 - Frequency of Council B reports (agency reports)
 - Internet capacity in remote communities / Council priorities
 - Harvest specifications timing *update only, more info in Oct*
 - Annual meeting schedule changes *update only, more info in Oct*
