

These estimates come from the "Fishery Management Plan and Environmental Impact Statement for Tanner Crab off Alaska", dated September 23, 1977. These estimates were based on a survey taken over one year ago by Rod Kaiser and Paul Tate, Alaska Department of Fish and Game of the Dutch Harbor Processors.

No known survey has been taken by a Government agency for the 1978 production based on possible sales. A telephone survey was taken of known Bering Sea processors on November 29th and November 30, 1977 asking, "What do you project your company's production of Bering Sea C. bairdi Tanner Crab will be in 1978, raw weight, based on known markets?" A figure of 107,000,000 pounds is the projected raw weight production. Three major processors; Whitney Fidalgo Seafoods, Inc., New England, and All Alaskan are not figured in this 107,000,000 pounds. A conservative estimate of their production would be another 17 million pounds.
