REPORT TO THE NORTH PACIFIC FISHERIES MANAGEMENT COUNCIL CONCERNING COAST GUARD FCMA ENFORCEMENT

- 1. Recent FCMA Infractions. Since the last council meeting 6 reports of violation (civil penalty) procedure and 7 citations (written warning) have been issued. In addition, one foreign fishing vessel was seized for FCMA infractions. A brief summary of each infraction follows.
- a. 26 May. USCGC CAMPBELL issued a citation to the Japanese longliner TENYO MARU No. 25 for failure to properly maintain the daily cumulative catch log.
- b. 26 May. USCGC CAMPBELL isued a citation to the Japanese tanner crab pot vessel KAISEI MARU No. 8 for failure to properly maintain its transfer log.
- c. 30 May. USCGC CAMPBELL issued two citations to the South Korean stern trawler SEO YANG HO for failure to properly display its permit and for failure to log prohibited species in the daily cumulative catch log.
- d. Ø6 June. USCGC MIDGETT issued a citation to the Soviet stern trawler KULUNDA for failure to properly maintain its catch and effort log and a report of violation for failure to maintain the daily cumulative log properly.
- e. Ø7 June. CGAS Kodiak issued a citation to the Japanese fishing vessel RYUHO MARU No. 31 for failure to maintain a legible IRCS.
- f. Ø8 June. USCGC MIDGETT seized the Soviet stern trawler MYS PROKOFYEVA for underlogging its catch of Atka Mackerel by approximately 67 tons following a boarding some 120 miles SW of the Shumigan Islands. The vessel was escorted to Kodiak and the case turned over to the U. S. Attorney in Anchorage for prosecution.
- g. 17 June. USCGC MIDGETT issued two reports of violation to the South Korean stern trawler HEUNG YANG HO for failure to return prohibited species to the sea in a timely manner and for failure to properly maintain the daily cumulative catch log.

- h. 24 June. USCGC MIDGETT issued a report of violation to the Soviet stern trawler PAUDZA for failure to properly maintain the daily cumulative catch log.
- i. 25 June. CGAS Kodiak issued a citation to the Japanese tanner crab pot vessel KEIYO MARU No. 38 for failure to maintain a legible IRCS.
- j. Ø2 July. USCGC MIDGETT issued a report of violation to the Japanese stern trawler ANYO MARU No. 8 for failure to properly maintain the daily cumulative catch log.
- k. 09 July. USCGC STORIS issued a report of violation to the Japanese stern trawler AKEBONO MARU No. 2 for failure to properly maintain the daily cumulative catch log.
