### **ESA Considerations**

 NMFS has an ongoing responsibility to ensure the fishery management actions it implements are not likely to jeopardize the continued existence of a listed species or result in the destruction or adverse modification of designated critical habitat.



## **Coordination Policy Directive**

- NMFS Policy 01-117
- Promotes early coordination with Councils throughout the section 7 consultation process
- Places particular emphasis on coordinating with the Council when changes to fishery management measures might be required to minimize adverse effects on listed species and critical habitat.
- Outlines the parameters of engagement given statutory and regulatory requirements and timeframes



## Fishery Management Actions

- Reinitiation of a previously completed consultation is required if a trigger is hit
- Reinitiation triggers include:
  - new species listings
  - new critical habitat designations
  - exceeding an authorized limit in an incidental take statement
  - new information that reveals effects on listed species not previously considered



# Situation that Applies to this BSAI FMP BiOp

- No pending Council action under consideration has triggered NMFS's obligation to reinitiate consultation on the BSAI FMP.
- Instead, new species listings, critical habitat designations, and take exceedances are driving the obligation to reinitiate consultation.
- The action under consideration is the authorization of status quo fishery management measures under the BSAI FMP.



## **BSAI FMP Reinitiation Triggers**

- Authorized take limits exceeded
  - Steller sea lion
  - Sperm whale
- Humpback whale reclassification (2016)
- Humpback whale critical habitat (2021)



### **BSAI FMP Additional Considerations**

- Proposed sunflower sea star listing (threatened)
- Updated information on species and ecosystem status available
- Separate GOA and BSAI opinions



## **BSAI FMP Consultation Process**

- NMFS Sustainable Fisheries Division prepared a Biological Assessment
- NMFS Protected Resources Division is evaluating the effects of the BSAI groundfish fisheries and parallel fisheries to ESA species and preparing a Biological Opinion
- Consultation addresses the status quo fisheries
- Conference opinion on sunflower sea stars



# BSAI FMP Species/DPS Considered

#### Marine mammals: 12 species, 13 DPSs

- Blue whale
- Fin whale
- Sei whale
- Mexico DPS humpback whale
- Western North Pacific DPS humpback whale
- Western North Pacific DPS gray whale
- Bowhead whale
- Fish: 2 species, 5 ESUs
  - Upper Willamette River ESU Chinook salmon
  - Lower Columbia River ESU Chinook salmon
  - Snake River spring/summer-run Chinook salmon
  - Hood Canal summer-run chum salmon
  - Columbia River chum salmon
- Invertebrate: Sunflower sea star

- North Pacific right whale
- Sperm whale
- Southern Resident killer whale
- Western DPS Steller sea lion
- Beringia DPS bearded seal
- Arctic ringed seal



## **BSAI FMP Critical Habitats Considered**

- Western North Pacific DPS humpback whale
- Mexico DPS humpback whale
- North Pacific right whale
- Southern Resident DPS killer whale
- Steller sea lion
- Beringia DPS bearded seal\*
- Arctic ringed seal\*



### Status of BSAI FMP consultation


- The draft BSAI FMP biological opinion is in review at AKR.
