Translating discussion into a report

- 9 breakout groups x 4 sessions = over 40 hours of discussion time!
- Present as ideas, not recommendations
- Capture full range of ideas as well as common themes
- Provide context where possible (region, fishery)







Workshop report – Broad themes of discussion

A few examples

- Process attributes inclusivity, trust, collaboration, transparency
- Management attributes facilitating stability, adaptability, flexibility, nimbleness, innovation; precautionary
- Need for prioritization but also forums for deeper/ongoing discussion
- Partnerships and coordination, including across government agencies
- Leveraging available information, investing in surveys, importance of diverse knowledge sources including LKTK and subsistence





Workshop report – Difficult questions, conversations, needs

A few examples

- Metrics for evaluating resilience
- Balance competing objectives and values, e.g. efficiency and participation
- Communicating expectations, e.g. for reduced productivity
- Aligning productivity and capacity
- Plan for everything? Plan for the worst?
- Tradeoffs between rapid response and deliberate, inclusive process






Workshop report – Specific ideas, tools, approaches
