The Council received \$2.6m in IRA funding from NMFS. IRA funds must be fully spent by the end of 2027.

The Council is making progress toward meeting each of its three grant objectives:

- 1. Develop a climate resilient management policy
- 2. Continue work to integrate Local Knowledge and Traditional Knowledge
- 3. Strengthen consideration of uncertainty and risk in harvest specifications





#### Workplan adaptations

- Initial delay in receiving funds
- Changes in regulatory and funding environment
- Limitations on NMFS and Council staff capacity
- Evolving Council priorities, including no further action on Programmatic Evaluation

# Cross-objective activities

Ongoing activities that support all 3 IRA objectives and enhance the Council's climate resilience planning work

- 1. Establishment of a Climate Resilience Workplan focused on near-term opportunities to incorporate existing and emergent climate science (December 2024; based on CCTF recommendations)
- Reconstitution of the Ecosystem Committee with new TOR, tasking, and membership
- 3. Development of outreach materials (particularly for Objective 3)



# 1 – Develop a climate-resilient management policy

- Originally supported by Programmatic Evaluation
- Now supported by Groundfish Management Policy triennial review
  - Existing requirement established in Groundfish FMPs
  - Opportunity to consider adjustments to FMP guidance
  - Consider a more cumulative review to support Objectives 1 and 2 and capture the Council's recent work on climate resilience and incorporation of LKTKS information. (Will discuss further under E – Staff Tasking.)





### 1 – Develop a climate-resilient management policy

#### Potential ideas for additional activities

- 2027 Climate Resilience Planning/IRA Wrap-Up Workshop
  - Discuss progress and plan for next steps to sustain climate resilience planning beyond the IRA grant period
  - Could build on 2024 Climate Scenarios Workshop, implementation of Climate Resilience Workplan, and other work in support of IRA objectives





# 1 – Develop a climate-resilient management policy

### Potential ideas for additional activities

- Crab FMP Management Policy Review
  - Apply or adapt approach used for Groundfish Management Policy Reviews
  - Consider optimal timing after discussing Groundfish review in June 2026





### 2 – Continue work to integrate Local and Traditional Knowledge

- Originally supported by Programmatic Evaluation
- Currently supported through Bering Sea Chum Salmon Bycatch Action
  - Incorporates LK, TK, the social science of LK and TK, and subsistence information
  - Can help inform practices for future analyses
- Staff will continue to further develop LKTK procedures, and carry out work informed by the Protocol





### 2 – Continue work to integrate Local and Traditional Knowledge

#### Potential ideas for additional activities

- Staff will continue to communicate with GOACLIM and CEFI leads regarding opportunities
- One opportunity would be to develop a process and/or guidance for incorporating LKTKS information into analyses in the Gulf of Alaska region
- Further guidance from the Council would be helpful for identifying opportunities, gaps, and specific needs to address.



### 3 – Strengthen consideration of uncertainty and risk in harvest specifications

- Staff co-leading collaborative work with NMFS AFSC to examine whether alternative harvest control rules could perform better than the status quo under changing ecosystem conditions
  - June SSC workshop
  - September: Staff update to Groundfish Plan Teams on HCRs under consideration for simulation testing
  - Early 2026: Additional GPT (January) and SSC discussions (February)
  - Council update June 2026, consideration of next steps
