D3 Climate Change Action Module

- The SSC appreciates the coordination between LK TK and CC groups
 - We *recommend* development of clear objectives for interactions
 - Joint efforts could focus on case studies to advance CCTF goals
- The SSC has continued concerns about redundancies with existing efforts (in particular ESR and ESP)
 - SSC recommends that CCTF contributes to enhancing the annual ESR, rather than producing separate 'climate report'
 - Red flags / emergent issues best handled through existing ESR
 - Focus of the CCTF should be on long-term, strategic planning
- The SSC re-iterates June 2019 recommendation that the Council develop Purpose and Needs Statements for the Action Modules

D3 Local Knowledge, Traditional Knowledge and Subsistence Taskforce Report

- The SSC commends the efforts by the taskforce to move this Action Module forward.
- The SSC noted that the workplan outlined by the taskforce is ambitious and will require an ongoing commitment of substantial Council and NMFS staff time.
- Three types of "repositories" of LK/TK/Subsistence information are proposed.
 - The SSC recommends development of specific plans for the sustainability of and access to these repositories.
 - The SSC recommends that the human subjects issues of informed consent, confidentiality, and risk to participants be central to the plans for the creation and maintenance of these repositories.

D3 Local Knowledge, Traditional Knowledge and Subsistence Taskforce Report

- The SSC recommends the taskforce explore the creation of protocols that would provide guidance when information derived from different LK or TK sources is inconsistent or contradictory.
- The SSC supports the plan to explore and synthesize a list of existing protocols and projects related to LK and TK and the social science of LK and TK as one of the first tasks to undertaken.
- The SSC recommends an additional focus on LK for non-subsistence fisheries and recommends the taskforce consider adding a member with nonsubsistence LK experience.
- The SSC recommends that in-person meetings of the taskforce be supported to the extent feasible, recognizing that the inclusion of key persons from remote communities is indispensable as well as expensive and logistically challenging.
