


IFQ MEETING AND REPORT

- IFQ Committee met virtually March 25 and 26
- Posted: Action memo, IFQ committee report and committee's eAgenda
- 1st day presentations and discussions on 2 Council actions (IFQ access opportunities & GOA sablefish pots), proposals, and several "non-action" items
- 2nd day prioritization of IFQ-related actions
 - A poll was used to canvas members on relative priority of items and their thoughts on complexity/ controversy
 - Members provided context to their votes through discussion that followed
- The report is organized by topic (rather than chronologically)

REMAINING IFQ TOPICS FROM THE COMMITTEE

1. New proposals

- Allow jig gear for sablefish
- Allowing onboard processing of sablefish B and C shares
- Lift Adak CQE residency requirements (3 to 5 years)

2. Other IFQ actions discussed relative to prioritization

- Small sablefish release action.
- Use of hired masters (from batter's box)
- IFQ transfer mechanisms (from batter's box)

NEW PROPOSALS: 1 OF 3

Allow jig gear for sablefish

- IFQ committee agreed that the proposal is useful and non-controversial. No opposition was voiced. A few members felt low priority item.
- Potential benefits to small boat fishermen or those who hold small amounts of sablefish quota





NEW PROPOSALS: 2 OF 3

Allow onboard processing of sablefish B and C shares

- IFQ committee agreed that the proposal is useful and non-controversial. Most members felt this is was not high priority relative to other action
- Few members noted their own experiences with limited markets in their home community; could benefit freeze trollers wanting to do direct marketing
- Weren't able to hear the shoreside processor perspective





NEW PROPOSALS: 3 OF 3

Lift Adak CQE residency requirements for 3 to 5 years

- IFQ committee agreed that the proposal is useful and non-controversial. Mixed feelings on prioritization.
- Proposer explained the residency requirement for harvesting ACDC's CQE was waived up until 2019. Within that timeframe they were able to prioritize residents.
- Combination of a closed processor and a pandemic has made it difficult to harvest their quota
- Buffer period longer than an emergency rule (3 to 5 years)





OTHER IFQ ACTIONS DISCUSSED RELATIVE TO PRIORITIZATION

Small sablefish release action

- The majority of the Committee think this action is a high priority
- The most common vote also suggested likely to have some complexity or controversy,
- Committee members favor the development of a discard mortality rate specifically for small sablefish, likely differing by pot- versus longline-caught.

Use of hired masters (from batter's box)

- Most diverse response from the committee
- Overall stay on the Council's list but not be tasked for further staff work at this time.

IFQ transfer mechanisms (from batter's box)

- Most Committee members listed this as a low priority and recommend keeping it on the list but not tasking staff work at this time
- Some overlapping intent with the access pool

OTHER PRESENTATIONS AND REVIEW ITEMS

IPHC economic impact survey

 Recommendation to clarify that the survey will accept estimates in lieu of exact numbers

IFQ cost recovery update

- Recommended that the Council request further detail on the methods used to allocate enforcement costs to the IFQ program.
- Recommended that the Council request to receive ongoing updates on any changes NMFS would need to make regarding reporting and invoicing procedures in order to implement an extended or year-round fishery.

Emergency rule update

- The emergency rule for the Rockfish Program effective for an April 1 opener.
- The IFQ transfer emergency rule effective 3/30/2021

NMFS IFQ Report to the Fleet

Committee provided a number of specific recommendations



OTHER BUSINESS

Proxy proposal

- Committee discussed a proposal to allow members to appoint alternates when they are not able to attend the Committee meeting, particularly when the meeting is occurring during the IFQ fishing season
- Broader policy call for the Council
- May be other ways to promote participation (timing and location considerations)
- Intent to meet more regularly
