I have the following comments to offer on the draft minutes of the Chairmen's meeting.

Page 6--Foreign recreational fishing

The minutes show that I seconded the motion made by Fullerton. This proposal was supported, among others, by the Western Pacific Council and I believe Yee or someone from Westpac seconded the motion.

Page 6--Alaska vote on Pacific Council

I suggest that the wording be changed to read, "Mr. Fullerton asked to hold the amendment in abeyance because the subject needs to be reconsidered by the Pacific Council, especially since the membership of the Council has changed from the time that the issue was initially addressed several years ago."

Page 10--Confidentiality of statistics

In the third paragraph which begins with "Bill Gordon said.....," I suggest adding the clause "such as that between the State of California and the Department of Commerce" after "existing state cooperation agreement."

If you recall, Fullerton voiced strong objection to the initial wording of the amendment since it would violate the cooperative agreement he has with the Secretary of Commerce.

Page 16--Emergency Actions


Second line, last word "which" is mistyped.
