





MREP ACCEPTING APPLICATIONS FOR NEXT WORKSHOP, FEB 26-MAR 1 2024, KODIAK, AK

IRA FUNDING OPPORTUNITY FOR COUNCILS

- Staff paper opportunity to provide input to Council

 - Provide top 3-5 priorities for each category



 - April: prioritize across inputs to come up with top list of 8-12 priorities




Public input process for research priorities during the 2023-2024 SSC/ Council cycle











FROM NMFS MANAGEMENT REPORT: NEPA CHANGES (1/2)


- Fiscal Responsibility Act amended NEPA statute
 - Effective June 3, 2023
- Biggest change: time limits for completing EA/EIS
 - EA: 1 year EIS: 2 years
 - Time clock starts when agency determines the need for NEPA; ends when the agency makes final determination (FONSI – Finding of No Significant Impact; or ROD – Record of Decision)
 - Fed agencies are still determining how to adapt procedures
 - NOAA GC says we must intend to keep to the statutory time limits
- Also:
 - Page limits 75pg EA, 150-300pg EIS (excludes appx)
 - Revisions to definitions/terminology

 action
